Dear Good People of St. Mary,

In the next few weeks we will be very busy putting together the Catalog of Parish Ministries for the upcoming annual Parish Life Weekend, September 20/21. For those of you who are new, each September St. Mary has several major events which, in a way, mark the "beginning of the ministry year": once everyone is back from vacations and summer activities, we start school at Holy Cross Academy, we open Religious Education for the year, and we have a big celebration Ice Cream Social, Cakewalk and Dance out at Holy Cross (September 14, this year it actually falls on the Feast of the Triumph of the Cross).

The following weekend, September 20/21, every ministry in the parish (nearly 100) presents their work under tents outside the church before and after all Masses, to let people get to know what the possibilities might be for their own participation in ministry, and know they are welcome to get involved. Ministries include all the major areas of work represented in committee by the Parish Advisory Board: education, outreach, liturgy, operations, and parish life (the social committee). We call this "Parish Life Weekend."

Included in the catalog packet that all 5,200+ households receive after Labor Day is a Commitment Card. Between Parish Life Weekend and the following weekend, "Commitment Sunday," all parishioners are asked to enter into a period of discernment, to ask the question: "How is God calling me to serve this year?" Sometimes, I think, this period of discernment is not taken so seriously, and people don't realize how seriously we need to take this matter of active participation/involvement in the life of the parish. Every parishioner should be involved in the work of the Church in some way, to give back in love what we have received in love. Everyone is asked to return the card as an outward sign of their internal disposition to pray, serve, support. Even those who are already serving in a ministry or ministries are asked to renew their commitment by completing a commitment card.

Anyway, on the weekend of September 27/28, Commitment Sunday, we offer these Commitment Cards as the second offering, an offering of how we commit to pray in the coming year, how we commit to serve, and how we commit to support the active mission of the parish which is the salvation of souls and service of others to the glory of God.

In a recent interview with a marketing firm who is seeking ways to best promote the services of Catholic Charities, I was asked what I thought was the role of the Pastor in getting people involved. I knew the answer they were looking for: the Pastor's job is to be the cheerleader, to encourage, to plead, to offer bribes where necessary and guilt as a last resort to those who will eventually wear down and give in to the request to take on a particular ministry as their extracurricular activity.

How many times have people taken on a "job" in the Church because "Father asked." And how many times have people, after a long period of time (or even a short one) begun to resent the time and energy that it takes? Ultimately, "I'm doing it for Father" doesn't cut it anymore. We see this so often. People burn out, and when their term is up they feel bad about the resentment they feel and drift away. Sometimes they disappear. It's like we use people up and call it mission.

This year our period of discernment will have a different approach. I am going to ask all of you to look into your hearts. In what way has God prepared this place *for you* so that your gifts—the gift that is you—might be realized? Not just used; *realized*. Because, you see, it isn't "Father" who calls the Church into being, it is God. Jesus isn't the sign of God's love, he *is* God's love. And he started the Church us—to be the living signs of his presence in the world.

It's a big job, but somebody has to do it. And we can only accomplish it in communion with him, together. For this reason, our theme this year is "Given in love, Called in love."

June 27, 2014 Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This coming September 27, we will have a unique opportunity both to deepen our faith and to invite a friend who is searching and open to faith. Inspired by Pope Francis' call in *Evangelii Gaudium* to "take this risk...take a step toward Jesus", our diocesan evangelization conference will be entitled *Risk Jesus*:

Saturday, September 27, 2014 9 a.m. – 4 p.m. Hylton Memorial Chapel in Woodbridge Keynotes: Jennifer Fulwiler, Fr. Juan Puigbo Fr. Dwight Longenecker, and music by Marie Miller Simultaneous (headset) translation into Spanish \$25 by August 31st, \$40 after Online registration: www.arlingtondiocese.org/riskjesus

With 1 in 10 Americans self-identifying as "former Catholics" and 1 in 5 adult Americans identifying as "Nones" (no religious affiliation), spiritual poverty is widespread. Keynote presenters including Jennifer Fulwiler, a former atheist, and Fr. Dwight Longenecker, a convert from Anglicanism, will address the concerns of these individuals. My prayer is that *Risk Jesus* will be a turning point in their lives—even as it strengthens the faith of practicing Catholics. The keynotes and music will emphasize witness, testimonial, and practical sharing of the faith. I will attend the entirety of the day, and will celebrate a Mass for the New Evangelization at 11:30 a.m.

However, our brothers and sisters on the margins of our parishes and communities will only attend if we extend a personal invitation to them and attend with them. In *Go Forth with Hearts on Fire*, I challenged all Catholies to "invite (at least) one" person to Christ and His Church. The subtitle for the *Risk Jesus* conference is "Take the first step. Bring a friend." This is an opportune moment for us to step outside our comfort zone and to invite a friend. I ask you to put this on your calendar and to invite a friend, family member, neighbor, or colleague to attend with you.


Augmenting the talks and music, attendees will have the opportunity to encounter Christ in the Mass, Confessions, Eucharistic Adoration, prayer, and to meet ministry leaders at the ministry exhibits. *Risk Jesus* will take place just one week before the Synod on the Family and one year before the Holy Father's anticipated pastoral visit to the United States. Join me in praying that *Risk Jesus* might both inflame the hearts of Catholies in our diocese and draw those on the margins to take a first step in faith.

Food for Families School Food Pantry

The mission of the School Food Pantry program is to help alleviate child hunger for families in crisis. School-based pantries are located on the grounds of a school to provide a more readily accessible source of emergency food assistance to students and their families. As a need is identified by school staff, the prepacked boxes containing a few days of emergency food, along with resource materials such as a pantry reference list and SNAP information, are distributed to the families in need.

Club Kids

This structured after-school snack program provides nutrition among at-risk children, ages 4-18 years, who qualify for free or reduced lunch and attend school at one of the schools now enrolled in the program. This mission of Club Kids is to provide nutritious snacks to at-risk children in an environment that is safe, accessible, and convenient. Over 3,000 kids are being fed monthly at sites throughout our service area. Sites are located at schools, faith-based organizations, the Boys and Girls Club, and Bragg Hill Family Life Center.

Kids on the Go Mobile Pantry

The Kids on the Go Mobile Pantry Program is designed to provide at-risk children who receive free or reduced lunch during the school year with a bag of nutritious, child friendly meals and snacks to take home each week during summer school when school meals are not available. Kids on the Go Mobile Pantry helps to alleviate childhood hunger by bridging the gap when a reliable source of food may not be available.
