Catholic Education: A history lesson

During the first half of the 20th century, Catholic Schools had sprung up all over the country, especially in cities. Each parish was eager to open its own school so that the children could receive an education that was rooted in our faith within the parish family. Due to the combination of the generosity of parishioners and the dedication of the Religious Sisters, brothers and priests who ran these schools, a Catholic Education was either free or very economical. Whenever possible, Catholic parents would send their children to the local parish school, which was typically within walking distance. It really was not a big decision; it was just what many Catholic families did.

Today, choosing where to send your children to school is a major decision for a family. Parish schools are cost-based, not free, although we are still blessed by generous parishioners who support and help our schools in many ways. It is not within walking distance for most people. In our area, we are blessed with good public schools and we have a wonderful Religious Education program. Our parish provides many opportunities for our children to learn the faith and be involved in the life of our parish. So, why choose a Catholic Education; how is it different?

When our children attend Catholic School, their entire education is centered upon Christ. Although they learn many of the same things they would learn elsewhere, they discover them within the context of the Gospel. When questions arise, the teachers, who are dedicated not only to excellence in academics but, more importantly, to drawing each child into a personal relationship

with God, will answer them with the Light of Christ shining through.

Developing an awareness of others is one of the central tenets of Catholic Education. Our children learn to see and respond to the needs of people both in far-away missions and right here in Fredericksburg. Their kind hearts open wide to our brothers and sisters because service is built right into the foundation of Catholic Education.

A Catholic School is family and community based in a unique way. There is a proverb that is often quoted about it taking a village to raise a child. We believe that it takes a parish to raise a child. Parents have the opportunity to learn and develop their faith when their children attend Catholic School. Pope Francis: Appeal for Iraqi Christians

(Vatican Radio) The Director of the Press Office of the Holy See, Fr. Federico Lombardi, SJ, has issued a statement communicating the Holy Father's prayerful concern over the violence raging in Iraq, and especially for the Christians affected by the violence. In the statement, Fr. Lombardi says, "The Holy Father is following with deep concern the dramatic news reports coming from northern Iraq, which involve defenseless populations. Christian communities are particularly affected: a people fleeing from their villages because of the violence that rages in these days, wreaking havoc on the entire region."

The statement goes on to say, "The Holy Father renews his spiritual closeness to all those who are suffering through this painful trial, and makes the impassioned appeals of the local bishops his own, asking together with them in behalf of their sorely tried communities, that the whole Church and all the faithful raise up with one voice a ceaseless prayer, imploring the Holy Spirit to send the gift of peace." Here is the full text of the statement :

The Holy Father is following with deep concern the dramatic news reports coming from northern Iraq, which involve defenseless populations. Christian communities are particularly affected: a people fleeing from their villages because of the violence that rages in these days, wreaking havoc on the entire region.

At the Angelus prayer on July 20th, Pope Francis cried with pain: "[O]ur brothers and sisters are persecuted, they are pushed out, forced to leave their homes without the opportunity to take anything with them. To these families and to these people I would like to express my closeness and my steadfast prayer. Dearest brothers and sisters so persecuted, I know how much you suffer, I know that you are deprived of everything. I am with you in your faith in Him who conquered evil!"

In light of these terrible developments, the Holy Father renews his spiritual closeness to all those who are suffering through this painful trial, and makes the impassioned appeals of the local bishops his own, asking together with them in behalf of their sorely tried communities, that the whole Church and all the faithful raise up with one voice a ceaseless prayer, imploring the Holy Spirit to send the gift of peace.

His Holiness urgently calls on the international community to protect all those affected or threatened by the violence, and to guarantee all necessary assistance – especially the most urgently needed aid – to the great multitude of people who have been driven from their homes, whose fate depends entirely on the solidarity of others.

The Pope also appeals to the conscience of all people, and to each and every believer he repeats: "May the God of peace create in all an authentic desire for dialogue and reconciliation. Violence is not conquered with violence. Violence is conquered with peace! Let us pray in silence, asking for peace; everyone, in silence.... Mary Queen of peace, pray for us!"

Catholic Charities: Migration and Resettlement Office teaches Pre-employment Skills

Our local Migration and Refugee Resettlement office has developed a pre-employment program to prepare newcomers for the American workplace. "We really can confidently refer our clients" says Laurel Collins, Director of the local Catholic Charities Fredericksburg Office. "They go through nine hours of pre-employment training where they learn about workplace expectations and cultural norms and all come with good work ethics."

Historically, clients tend to stay in jobs longer compared to non-refugees, are very reliable and dependable, pass drug screens, are permanently, legally authorized to work and appreciate their jobs. Most come with varied work experiences and skills to offer and very rarely are there any job-related issues with the clients. If any issues do arise, employers have the office staff's support to mediate or coach the clients on their work or to help resolve an issue.

For example, the staff worked with a client that was employed by United Sprinkler to learn the

terminology for the tools. "We worked with the manager to make a picture book of the tools and parts with their various names, as a means of getting him up speed. We have also helped clients to study and learn menus, and assisted with training in the kitchen and at cleaning jobs." Employers tend to like knowing that there is support for the clients in their transition to a new work environment. The staff assists with new hire paperwork and makes sure all the necessary legal and tax documents are completed correctly.

In their most recent Pre-Employment Training session, there was a surgeon, two civil engineers and two who men have worked in construction with the Army Corps of Engineers. The MRS office is happy to provide resumes of clients, and invite employers to consider them as a potential referral service. It is not the expectation that the new skill match their previous employment capacity, however there is tremendous potential here for good skilled employees.
