from our pastor



Dear Good People of Saint Mary,

It was a flawless day, I don't remember having had such a perfect day for the Ice Cream Social Cakewalk and Dance. I found myself standing back, looking at what we have done in building this community and felt a deep sense of joy. Here, at least, was a capsule of peace, where people could come together and just enjoy the afternoon, the ice cream and one another, kids could run around in safety and real connections were made among people.

If only it were so everywhere – right? We are so grateful that God has given so much to us, but we are also painfully aware that it is not so in many places in the world. The stories of human cruelty and suffering multiply daily becoming uncountable instances of desperate need. What can we possibly do to help ease their sadness and suffering? To make the world a safe and peaceful place for all God's children?

Of course, we reach out in whatever way we can. And we pray. When I was writing the intercessions for Mass last week this idea was on my heart, and we prayed: "That the wrongs that others do may NOT be kept alive in us in the form of discrimination, judgment and hatred; that we may be examples of Christ's love, we pray to the Lord." I think this is the most difficult aspect of evil and sin, that its damage can cause us to sin, too, as we are dealing with its effects. We can decide to keep the effects of

these sins alive and damaging. Sins of hatred must not cause others to hate; it is easy to fall into this trap. Then evil has won the day.

But if we were able to respond in love? Well, that is the idea we are all familiar with, but it is not so easy in action as it is in concept. "Hate the sin but love the sinner" is a hard teaching.

We can't condemn whole peoples or cultures for what we are seeing happening around us, no matter how horrible the images on television or unthinkable the reports. Terrible crimes have been committed in the name of religion – ours, too – ever since human beings have been involved. It isn't the religion driving it, ever; it is in the evil choices of extremists who have hijacked truth and twisted its interpretation to their purposes.

But we must condemn the actions and do what we can to prevent them, together, and do everything we can to make sure that the actions end there.

In response, then, we must be people of truth who reveal it in our own lives. We seek it in others, and respond to it in love when it is found. We encourage it, we teach it and form it in our young people and learn it from the wisdom of our elders. And we keep alive in our memories the beautiful afternoon and the gathering of family and friends as a reminder that God continues to bless, and to guide us.

October 4: Life Decisions Presentation: Making Life Decisions Guided by Your Catholic Faith

Join Fr. Don Rooney, David Mathers, Regis Keddie and Bob Mueller of the Diocesan Development Office for a seminar on end-of-life planning which includes liturgical, sacramental, medical and financial planning. Let us know you are coming: 9:30–1pm in the Parish Life Center.

Often the Liturgical and Sacramental needs and expectations of the Church are not conveyed or discussed until our mortality is upon us or a loved one. Please join us on October 4 for an informative talk on how our faith handles endof-life issues. Fr. Don Rooney and Mr. David Mathers, Director of Sacred Music, will discuss the importance and the purpose of the Anointing of the Sick, planning of the traditional Vigil, the Mass of Christian Burial, the Rite of Committal at the cemetery and the internment/burial practices of the Church. We have a very rich sacramental tradition that is often overlooked, particularly if our surviving spouse or family member(s) are not familiar with our faith tradition. We will also discuss, Catholic Advance Medical Directives as outlined by the Church and Planned Giving and Estate Planning.

Mr. Robert Mueller, Director of Development for the Catholic Diocese of Arlington will discuss the importance of personal planning and the legal steps required for Wills, Trusts, Powers of Attorney, Charitable Gift Planning and a review of the Advance Medical Directive. Catholic Advanced Medical Directive brochures, Catholic Estate and Personal Planning Workbooks and Funeral Planning materials will be available at the seminar and this information can also be found in the Parish Information Center in the vestibule of the Church and the Parish Website. We purchased six copies of a spiritual walking book to guide and inspire us with this journey. This book, *Christ Walk: A 40 Day Spiritual Fitness Program*, is available to borrow a week at a time from the Parish Library. This will give an opportunity for every one to share. Please call your Parish Nurse if you wish to sign out a copy.

Let's go over a few Safety reminders.

- 1. Wear appropriate shoes. They will keep you balanced.
- 2. Walk in pairs. This is to make sure you both are looking out for each other while you share your thoughts about the *Christ Walk* book you have read.
- 3. Please pace yourself. This is not a Race. Listen to your body. Every one is a Winner.
- 4. Distance is up to your discretion. The walking path is marked every ½ mile with markers up to three miles.
- 5. You can walk on your own any day of the week if you wish. Jot down your mileage for your own record. It will be encouraging to see how far you improved if this your first time.
- 6. Please Eat Breakfast. Your body needs fuel.

This organized walk is every Saturday after 9am Mass starting September 27, ending November 1.

On November 8 your Health Ministry Team of Nurses will re-check your numbers if you wish. There will be \$10 fee for this re-check to cover the cost of the cholesterol kits.

REAP Scholarship Grants

The Religious Education Assistance Program (REAP) is a scholarship grant program developed and administered by Fredericksburg Council #4034 of the Knights of Columbus. The purpose of the program is to support Catholic school education by providing financial assistance in the form of grants to families who, because of financial difficulties, are unable to fully pay the current year's tuition at Holy Cross Academy, Saint John Paul the Great High School, or St. Michael High School. The student's effort and potential for academic success is also an important consideration. This program does not provide financial assistance for students enrolled in the parish Religious Education Program.

Grants up to the amount of \$2,000 will be awarded. Grants are for the current academic year only. Families may reapply for new grants in succeeding academic years if financial difficulties persist or recur. Scholarship grants awarded under this program will be paid directly to the appropriate school.
