Dear Good People of Saint Mary,

It used to be after Christmas you could heave a sigh of relief that everything went so well and then slow down for a few weeks before Lent began. Not so, anymore! As I write this article on Monday, 1/5, we are exactly three months until Easter, a month and a half from Ash Wednesday and there is much to tell you about.

I want to tell you about the dialogue that began today between six members each of Fredericksburg United Methodist Church and Saint Mary —that will need to wait until another week.

This weekend we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, the end of the quick Christmas Season and a day that we all consider the impact of this baptism event in our own lives. It means, among so many other things, that just as all this would be meaningless without Jesus' Presence to us—in liturgy, in life, in ministry—especially and in a particularly remarkable way in the Eucharist—that it also requires that we also be present to him.

We have to be here, in his Presence, because *to be present* to the Love of God *is to be transformed*. This Presence must happen both ways.

This weekend we have surrounding us on the walls of the church photos of the children of the parish—at Holy Cross Academy and in our Religious Education Program—after we celebrated Family Week. We invited parents to attend RE classes with the children and prepare a photo, adding what gifts they have received from God that might actually be part of God's calling them to the Consecrated Life as a Sister, a Nun, a Priest or a Monk. So many kids, so many gifts. They are with us in the church to remind us of who we are, how we are called, how we need to be present to God night and day, how we must nurture and support these gifts which God has given us not for ourselves, but to build up his Church.

They are a reminder of how we must pray for each other, and place ourselves in the presence of God every moment of our lives to learn the depths and beauty of this relationship to which God has called us, to live in his love.

Today, we are called by our baptism into his Loving Presence, he who is Love, to be transformed. And every moment is a new beginning. So, as we seek to *live into* our baptism, here is a program of spiritual exercises I invite you to take advantage of this year. I challenge you to use any or all of these opportunities to their fullest, because they are a coming together of several programs just at the right time in the life and spiritual development of our parish, and we will grow together. It won't happen again for a long time. Some of it you already know about.

Begin with the Called and Gifted Workshop, use the season of Lent to build your small group skills while we catch up on all the one-on-one Gift Consultations, and then begin the Small Groups for Called and Gifted in learning and living your gifts in everyday life.

Building Leaders

As we headed back to school this week, we reflected on some of the opportunities our students have experienced over the last few months. In November, 4 eighth graders and 4 seventh graders from HCA were chosen to participate in the **West Point Leadership Ethics and Diversity in STEM (LEADS) Workshop**. This LEADS Workshop is designed to increase the intensity and scope of work for our future leaders. Students competed in four rotations of Drones, VEX, Bridge building and Leadership Ethics. This is our 4th year participating in this exciting program.

Two of our 8th graders, Tanya V. and Robert Hocter, were chosen Leaders among Leaders by their groups. This is particularly significant because these groups included high school students this year alongside the middle schoolers. Robert's group won the distinction of having the best Leadership skit. These skits were performed by the older attendees and all demonstrated their handling of an ethical dilemma.

In December, four 7th grade girls were invited to the **STEM Mentoring Café**, sponsored by the Department of Energy to engage young ladies interested in learning about the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering and Math. Forty female STEM professionals were present to talk about their careers in STEM fields and to answer questions from the students. It was co-sponsored by the Museum of Natural History and took place there. The mentors not only signed up to participate in this event, but will also volunteer 20 hours to the schools who were present. The program was designed to showcase women's careers in STEM fields.

Building leaders and opening the future to each student are two important aspects of our HCA Middle School. We believe in each child and want all of them to realize the wonderful potential God has given them.

You were Given in Love; you are Called in Love.

What is the Called and Gifted Workshop?

The *Called and Gifted Workshop* helps lay Catholics discern the unique work of love to which God is calling them and to discover how God as empowered them, already, to carry it out. To date over 90,000 Catholics in over 110 dioceses have attended the Workshop in parishes througout the world, learning about the crucial role every lay Catholic has in the mission of the Church to bring Christ's love to our neighbors and our culture.

Why should I attend?

Because Christ is calling you. Christ *needs* you, to carry his love to others in a way only you can do. No one else has your particular background, experience, gifts and onnections. No one else can take your place.

Over and over again, long-time Catholics have asked after the Workshop, "How come I have never heard of this before?" If you are a cradle Catholic with years of Catholic schooling or have been through the RCIA, chances are that you never fully received Christ's teachings on lay participation in her mission and have never received an opportunity to discover for yourself how Christ is calling *you*, uniquely and personally.

What will I learn?

What the Church teaches:

- Church teaching on the role of the laity
- The identity of the "Lay Apostle"
- How ordained and laity properly collaborate

Are you going through, or planning to make, a transition in your life? Perhaps your children have recently left home. Perhaps you want to return to work after an absence, or you are considering a call to the priesthood or religious life. Today is Religious Freedom Day

Today, January 11, 2015, the Knights of Columbus Rappahannock Assembly will celebrate the 238th Anniversary of Thomas Jefferson's drafting of the Act of Religious Freedom for Virginia. A parade will begin at 1:30pm at the VRE Station in Fredericksburg, followed by a ceremony at 2pm at the religious Freedom Monument on Washington Avenue. All are invited. In January of 1777, a committee met in Fredericksburg to revise all of Virginia's laws as the Commonwealth made her way from being a colony to becoming a state in a new nation. Thomas Jefferson, a member of the committee, drafted a "Bill for Establishing Religious Freedom" which would go on to serve as the basis for the First Amendment of the Constitution. Jefferson considered this one of the three things he was most proud of during a lifetime of great accomplishments. From the Virginia Statute for Religious Freedom:

"...all men shall be free to profess...their opinions in matters of religion and that the same shall in no wise diminish, enlarge or affect their civil capacities."

Every year in January, near the statue of Hugh Mercer and Mary Washington's grave, the Assembly of the Knights of Columbus, supported by the Commandery of the Knights Templar, host a parade and ceremony at the Religious Freedom Memorial in Fredericksburg, Virginia, honoring this great and historic event. Each year, the Knights of Columbus invites a special guest speaker and honors the religious leaders of every faith in the local community. What appeals most and what few people understand, is the labored relationship through history that surrounds

the Roman Catholic Church and Freemasonry. Because of this, the symbolism of the Knights of Columbus and the Knights Templar, marching together, is significant and well represents the ideas of Freedom and Tolerance that Thomas Jefferson had envisioned for his state, and later his nation. A vision which promises America that our Strength comes from our Diversity, embracing the idea of God, yet allowing each human to decide their own path to him.


Children's Offertory Envelopes For January
