HOLY CROSS ACADEMY

Dear Good People of Saint Mary,

Please receive our best wishes for Easter joy and blessings to you and your families during these happy days of Easter. The Lord is risen, indeed, and we are changed.

Throughout these Holy Days of Jesus' passion, and death and resurrection, we have found a continuing theme and profound reflection on the power of remembrance.

At the Last Supper, Jesus' own words are "Do this in remembrance of me," and we spoke about how Jesus' own understanding of that word is quite different from our way of remembering an event or feeling in our lives. The power of our memory, with sacramental grace, makes the event not happen again, but the "present moment" when that event happened is made really present to us now, at this moment in time. Of course, Jesus knew what he was doing. When he says "This is my body," it is not only at that evening hour before his arrest that it happened. God is not limited by time, and what God does, God does once, for all time. All moments are saturated by God's eternal moment. Our humanity is forever saturated by Jesus' desire for Communion with us, changed by his being really present—"present" in the sense of the word meaning both *here* and *now*.

It continues on Good Friday. Having received recently the new translation of the Mass, there is a word that we use now that we didn't use before, the word "conciliation." It is an interesting word, given in definition as "the action of stopping someone from being angry, placation," or "the action of mediating between two diputing persons or groups." The prayers of the Mass always refer to the Eucharist as the act of conciliation, that which could not have occurred in absence of Jesus' offering of himself on Calvary, for us and for our salvation. For you. Once again, our memory, combined with sacramental grace, makes this moment now: both in Eucharist and in confession. Our work is a work of re-membering, re-presenting, re-conciliation. It is the work of union with God.

This mystery of our memory is something that is most undeveloped as an integral part of our spirituality. Memory requires prior experience, it also requires a desire to recall. Maybe I'm just getting older, but I seem to hold onto the things

that I know I must remember, and don't retain so readily the mundane details, routine minutiae of everyday life. Saint Augustine and Saint Thomas Aquinas, however, give much importance to the memory. Without it, both say, we could not be fully human. It is likely one of the things that sets us apart from "lower forms" of life, the ability to learn, to apply knowledge to circumstances in the form of wisdom, helping us to not make the same mistakes over and over. But also to do the good and noble things of our exalted humanity over and over! Imagine how frustrating it might be to glimpse the truth only once, and know that it was gone from that moment forward.

Today I think about my Uncle John: he is in memory care in Kansas City. He remembers his family. The last time I visited I loaded a bunch of 50 year-old family photos in my phone. He was delighted to see them and remembered all of them and told many stories. But he can't tell you what day it is, or what he had, or even if he had, breakfast. He forgets that you came to see him and is pleasantly surprised while you are sitting there with him: "When did you get here?," he smiles.

All his life he went to Mass every day. It was the most important thing to him. And he took Communion every day to people in nursing homes. Now, at Villa Saint Francis, he goes to Mass every day still. They tell me he knows every prayer, sings all the hymns, finds moments of great peace in the middle of days that are confusing and frustrating for him, as he realizes he is losing his grip on memory. If you ask him, he can never tell you whether he went to Mass or not that day, though he did. But notice, he hasn't lost his grip on the present moment, only of his memory of it.

Of course, when we are in heaven, everything (and I mean *everything*) is now, everything we have ever or will ever know. There will be no need of memory, it will all be the moment of blinding flash, joy of new life. It will be fresh morning and empty tombs, all will be alive and all potential will be fulfilled. The moment of sacrament, a song that fills our senses and a complete peace we have never known—there will be no longer past and future.

But for now, we are people of hope, living in a prayer and a song we call to mind, a memory of God's great love for us in Jesus. Alleluia! God bless you.

So Far: An Amazing Year in Faith Formation for Adults at Saint Mary.

We are thrilled to announce that we have just completed 120 consultations from our most recent Called & Gifted Gifts Discernment Workshop held in February. A total of 498 parishioners have completed one or more segments of the instructional portion of the discernment process. The continuing program invites all members of our community to come back together in small groups to hear, share and discuss how God might be calling each of us to use our Baptism gifts to witness Christ's love, to serve one another, and to build up of his church.

Also this past week, we celebrated the conclusion of our **Lenten Small Groups** series that brought together 43 groups of friends (some new) and neighbors, over 400 participants from Saint Mary, to read Scripture, to share their faith experiences with one in other in love and hospitality, and be transformed.

In the next several weeks, three additional groups will finish their spring sessions of bible study; the **Gospel of Matthew** Bible Study held Thursday mornings, the women's program(s), **Walking with Purpose** held Wednesday evenings and **Choosing the Better Part** meeting Thursday evenings.

So What's Next?

Many have expressed how wonderful each of these programs have provided opportunities to grow deeper in their faith and a personal relationship with God and the chance to get to know tellow parishioners, drawn together in Christ, praying with one another moving forward in Discipleship.

For those who have completed the Called & Gifted Workshop and the Discernment consultation, we invite you to respond to our invitation to our small group sessions forming shortly after **Easter**. You will receive an email with dates and times that should meet most every schedule. The door is not closed on **scheduling** a consultation for those who have completed any of the three workshops since September. Please contact the parish office and we will make arrangements to speak with you. Our hope is that in the next several months, we will offer another Called & **Gifted Workshop** to continue to build on the Holy Spirit's work in our parish community.

In addition, for those who have completed the Lenten Small Group series or any of the other study groups, including Called & Gifted, you are invited to consider the following options for further formation and study:

Ouest

A lectionary based program that reflects on the upcoming Sunday readings (like BeTransformed), Quest publishes three books a year (fall, winter/spring and summer) which allows a group to decide the frequency they would like to meet. Quest comes with opening and closing prayers (with a music CD), written commentary on the Sunday readings and small group discussion questions. The participant fee is about \$8 per semester. For more information on Quest go to http://www.sccquest.org/quest/ quest.html. Groups can meet

weekly, biweekly, or monthly. Each group is free to set their own meeting schedule.

Matthew Kelly's "The Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic"

Four things make the difference between highly engaged Catholics and disengaged Catholics: The Four Signs of a *Dynamic Catholic*. Whether you are ready to let God take your spiritual life to the next level or want to help reinvigorate your parish, *The Four Signs of* a Dynamic Catholic promises to take you on a journey that will help you to live out the genius of Catholicism in your everyday life. This book seeks to change the way we live our faith and the way we teach our faith. It has a downloadable study guide, providing materials for groups to meet for six sessions. It requires that participants read the chapters associated with each session in advance of a meeting, and includes opening and closing prayers, and questions for discussion for each session. Groups can choose the frequency of meetings i.e.: weekly for six weeks, bimonthly for 3 months or monthly for six months. The fee is \$3 per book for orders of 6 or more and books can be ordered at http://cart. dynamiccatholic.com/Bulk-The-Four-Signs-of-a-Dynamic-Catholic-p/fs-sc-multi.htm.

Option III

For those who are interested in choosing their own topic or book, a simpler format for small groups. Please contact the parish office for a group facilitation guide. The format begins and ends with prayer, and includes questions to help group members discern how they have grown in their spiritual life since the last meeting.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Risen Lord Jesus,

As you are aware, I urged us in my Lenten message to implore the Lord Jesus to form our hearts, so that we would emerge at Lent's end as a people whose hearts beat in accord with His. Strengthened by prayer, purified by fasting and other forms of penance, and committed to almsgiving, our hearts are now more in sync with the Heart of Jesus Christ, on fire with love for Him and for all our brothers and sisters, especially for those most in need.

We have more intentionally been united to the Lord Jesus as we relived His suffering, death, and resurrection through our participation in the liturgies of the Easter Triduum. As we rejoice this Easter Day in Our Savior's triumph over sin and death, we are keenly aware that we too must continue to share in His triumph, dying to our self-centeredness and living instead for the Lord and for others.

During Lent, we were re-created, so that in the weeks and months ahead, the power of Christ's love may be at work in us, enabling us to be "missionary disciples" as we invite those we encounter to come to Jesus, so as to experience His transforming love themselves. Just like the first disciples, we are sent forth by the Risen Lord Jesus to evangelize, primarily by our witness in daily life, but also in our conversations and dialogue. An aspect of our witness embraces our reaching out to the needy in practical ways, so as to make visible Jesus Christ's loving care for them.

The Risen Lord Jesus will transform our hearts in answer to our request that He do so. With hearts formed like His, we can truly live as His disciples, witnesses to the power of His risen life at work in us.

Keeping you in daily prayer through this Easter season and beyond, I remain
