Dear Good People of Saint Mary,

It has been a while since I've written about housekeeping items in church, but since we are coming into the summer season and it seems that the complaints are coming in more numerously, now is as good a time as any to cover some of these things. So I have a few invitations for you, as you come to Mass.

Invitation 1

Please reflect on what you are about to wear to Mass. Fashion, like language, says so much about you, and I suspect there are many people who are saying a lot of things that they do not intend (at least I hope so). Some forms of clothing are never appropriate, and definitely not at Mass. I understand that people just don't spend money on dress clothes anymore, and maybe can't, but when you buy attire please consider items that include sufficient fabric to actually clothe. I think this is important. Sometimes when people come to confession and ask if cussing is a sin, I say to them that, for some words, the verdict may still be out. But, I ask, is that how you want people to remember you? We as a society have bought wholesale the cheap look of disrespect for self and others: it isn't appropriate anywhere.

Invitation 2

If you are parents with young children, you are invited to check out the cry room. I spoke with one family with young children last weekend, new to the parish, who were not aware that we have one. We welcome children, we love them, too—but you have no idea how hard it is to focus on giving a homily when there is so much going on in the church. I am also aware, from what I have heard from many, how hard it is also to pray.

Phone conversations in the pews, reading children's books to your family, conversations, noisy toys—all these things need to be kept outside the doors of the church. Church is for one purpose, for us to pray as Jesus to the Father. And when we get in the way of people who are seeking that goal, we *are* the problem. And we are not teaching our kids to be reverent and attentive.

Here are a few rules for the cry room.

 It is for crying. If your children are crying this is your place for the moment. If your children are good, don't go in there until you need to.
 It is not for playing. Parents have told me that they don't go in there because there are children playing and they don't want this to be what their children learn about church.

3. If you do not have crying children, you may not use the room. A number of people seem to like going in there; those seats are for parents who are trying to hold it together with their kids.

Invitation 3

To be helpful, if you don't have young children, try to sit on the choir side of the church; then parents with crying children don't have so far to go. Don't fill up the seats in front of the cry room windows if you don't have young children. Likewise, if you have potentially upset children, please sit near the cry room or vestibule so you can gain rapid escape. When I was a kid the Monsignor of the parish frequently put in the bulletin: "Good intentions, like crying babies, should be carried out immediately."

Invitation 4

I invite you to consider the need for silence in the church before and after Mass. It is the general and honorable practice of the Church (and a good one) to pray silently in preparation for Mass: "Lord, open my heart to hear your Word; Lord open my heart to receive your Life." People might be trying to pray the rosary, meditate on the readings of Sacred Scripture for today's Mass in the missalette, even praying Morning Prayer or Evening Prayer of the Liturgy of the Hours. But imagine how hard this can be when there is so much going on around you. For this reason I ask that everyone observe this respectful silence before Mass. Actually, we are one of the best parishes for this that I have seen, but we get a little off our form in the summer.

Also, after Mass is a good time to make a special silent prayer of thanksgiving to God for his goodness today.

Invitation 5

This is the one people tell me to write about the most, many want announcements before Mass begins... Beware the diabolical devices of mobile communications! Really. We all have to have one, but there is a silent mode that we should all take advantage of. I'm guilty, too, but it only took one time for my phone to ring during consecration for me to remember to switch it off before entering the church. Please, I invite you to shut off anything that is going to speak with any kind of tone other than human praise and thanks.

parish life fortnight for freedom



June 4, 2015

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus,

In just a few short weeks the fourth "Fortnight for Freedom" will take place from June 21-July 4. I join my brother bishops again in calling for a special time of prayer, study, and public action for the protection of our first freedom – religious liberty – at home and abroad. This year's theme is "Freedom to Bear Witness" to the truth of the Gospel. The word "martyr" in Greek is translated as "witness." To bear witness to Christ, to proclaim the Good News in its fullness, requires a willingness to suffer for its sake. We must ask ourselves, "Are we prepared to proclaim the Good News in season and out?"

This particular Fortnight comes at a time in which current threats to religious liberty in our own country are numerous, and religious persecution and restriction abroad are staggering. I encourage you to use this period of time for prayer, study, and advocacy so that you are equipped with the spiritual and practical resources you need to bear witness to the fullness of your faith in our culture. More information is available at www.arlingtondiocese.org/religiousliberty.

I invite you to join me at the opening Mass for the Fortnight for Freedom offered by Archbishop William Lori on Sunday, June 21 at 10:45 a.m. at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Baltimore, Maryland. A closing Mass will be celebrated by Cardinal Donald Wuerl with homilist Archbishop Thomas Wenski of Miami, FL, at 12 p.m. on July 4 at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C.

Lastly, I invite you to a special diocesan event on Saturday, June 27 at the Church of St. Ambrose in Annandale. We will be setting aside our own morning for prayer and education on religious liberty as a diocesan community. The day will begin with our monthly Respect Life Mass at 9 a.m. and will be followed by a presentation on religious freedom by Fr. David Pignato, S.T.D., J.D., a priest of the Diocese of Fall River and Professor at St. John's Seminary, Boston.

On June 20, 2014, Pope Francis said, "Religious freedom is not just a matter of thought or private decision. It is the freedom to live – both privately and publicly – according to the ethical principles that are a consequence of the truth found." I ask you to join me in praying through the intercession of our diocesan patron, St. Thomas More, whose feast day is on June 22, that we and our brothers and sisters throughout the world may enjoy the freedom to bear witness to our faith in its fullness.

MARRIAGE AND THE SUPREME COURT

The Supreme Court is now considering whether states can define marriage as the union of one man and one woman, and whether a state that does so must recognize a "marriage" contracted out-of-state by two persons of the same sex.

The Court is expected to rule on both questions by the end of June. A broad, adverse ruling would redefine marriage in the law throughout the entire country, changing thousands of laws regarding marriage, family and children and threatening religious freedom in numerous ways. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has urged the Supreme Court to *uphold* the right of states to define marriage as the union of husband and wife and to recognize only such unions, all for the good of society and particularly for children.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

ADVOCATE FOR MARRIAGE

Don't be afraid to talk about it.

Be a witness for the truth of marriage. Take advantage of opportunities to speak about it kindly with family, friends, neighbors or co-workers. Be prepared for false charges of discrimination and to respond with the following truths in charity.

What is marriage?

Marriage is the permanent and exclusive union of one man and one woman, for the good of the spouses and for the procreation and education of children. **One man, one woman, for life.**

The difference *is* the difference.

Men and women are equal and different. Sexual difference is essential to marriage and raising children. Ignoring or removing "the difference is... the problem, not the solution" (Pope Francis).

Mothers and fathers matter.

They aren't interchangeable. While single parents and others raising children often make heroic sacrifices and deserve support, society should also affirm every child's basic, natural right to come from and be raised in the loving marital union of his or her own father and mother.

Protecting marriage matters to everyone.

Law is a teacher, and redefining marriage in the law teaches that one sex is interchangeable with the other, and that either a mother or a father is dispensable as a parent. It teaches that marriage is whatever "consenting adults" say it is, and that adults have a "right" to children they did not conceive. These are simply false.

Lenten Soup Supper beneficiary:

Fredericksburg City Public Schools Summer Nutrition program

During the 2013-2014 school year there was a needs assessment conducted to determine the nutritional needs of students enrolled in the Fredericksburg City Public Schools. For many, there was a lack of positive nutritional practices during the summer months when school was not in session. The "food truck" concept was formed as a practical means of getting meals to the children, particularly with transportation being an issue during the summer months.

A meals reimbursement program is already in place through the Virginia Health Department (VHD). The local program was developed, and set into motion last July, providing meals in Bragg Hill, Mayfield and Hazel Hill. The program continues to develop in hopes of provide meals for children in other areas of the City.

Our Lenten Soup Supper donations, totaling \$ 1,314.30, are being offered to assist in providing nutritious meals to children in the Fredericksburg area being served by this program. Brian Kiernan, Foodservice Director, for the Fredericksburg City Public Schools has been instrumental in getting this program off the ground.
