
Kraków in the Capital

The Called & Gifted™ Discernment Process has been used since 1993 by over 75,000 lay, ordained, and religious Catholics and other Christians around the world. The Called & GiftedTM process is designed to help Christians discern the presence of charisms in their life.

Called & GiftedTM is a three part discernment process intended to help lay Catholics discern their charisms. All three parts of the process are necessary to determine where you are gifted.
