#### A JOURNEY OF FAITH

The Saint Mary Adult Choir, with members of the Saint Mary Folk Choir and led by our director of music, David Mathers, is making a pilgrimage January 25 - February 3, 2017 to holy sites in central Italy. The Choir will sing for Mass at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome, at the **Basilica of St. Francis** in Assisi, at the Cathedral in the ancient mountain town of **Orvieto** and in **Holy Trinity Church** in Florence. The Choir will also perform a concert of sacred music in Rome at the Church of St. Ignatius in the Campus Martius. The Choir will attend a **General Audience with the Holy Father** as well as the celebration of Solemn Vespers on the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, presided over by Pope Francis.

### SPIRITUAL BENEFITS

Rome and Assisi have long been places of pilgrimage for Christians: Rome, as the place where Saints Peter and Paul, founders of the Roman Church, died and were buried, and

Assisi, where Saint Francis was born, lived and died. These places offer the opportunity for prayer and contemplation, and provide a connection with our fellow Catholic Christians both past and present—our forbearers in the faith whom we venerate and our brothers and sisters whose faith we share today.

Prayer will be an important part of the Choir Pilgrimage. The Saint Mary Choir and those traveling with the Choir will celebrate Mass each day in some of the most ancient communities of our Church. An opportunity to celebrate the Liturgy of the Hours each day will also be offered.

The Saint Mary Choir will carry your prayers with them on their pilgrimage, and will pray for your intentions daily. We will provide the opportunity for you to enroll your specific prayer intentions.

#### Fr. John Mosimann



Father Mosimann was born in Rockville, Maryland, one of eight children. He graduated from high school 1985. In 1989, he graduated from the University of Dallas in Irving, Texas, with a degree in physics. He went on to study philosophy and theology at the Franciscan

University of Steubenville, Ohio, and later pursued a graduate degree in physics at the University of Maryland. He then volunteered for a year of missionary service in Mexico. In 1993, he entered St. Charles Borromeo Seminary in Wynnewood, Pennsylvania, where he earned master's degrees in divinity and moral theology. As a deacon he served at Our Lady of Angels Church in Woodbridge. He was ordained by Arlington Bishop John R. Keating May 17, 1997, at the Cathedral of St. Thomas More in Arlington. He served as parochial vicar of St. Leo the Great Church in Fairfax, 1997-2000; All Saints Church in Manassas, 2000-04; and St. John the Apostle Church in Leesburg in 2004. In October 2004, he was named temporary administrator of St. John the Apostle. He was appointed administrator in June 2005 and pastor in 2007.

### Fr. Colin Davis



Father Colin, the fifth of seven children, has lived in many states. As a youth, he lived in California, New York, Maryland, and Virginia and graduated from Seton School in Manassas. After

high school, his work as a lay Legionaries of Christ missionary took him from Connecticut to Arizona, and even to Mexico. He spent eight years preparing to be a Legionary priest but in 2009 decided his calling was to be a diocesan priest. With this decision in place, he studied two years at the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus, Ohio, and four at the Theological College at Catholic University in Washington. He spent his diaconate year at St. Veronica Church in Chantilly and was ordained a priest on June 11, 2016 at the Cathedral of St. Thomas More in Arlington by Archbishop Timothy P. Broglio of the U.S. Archdiocese for the Military Services. Father Colin's first assignment is to serve as a parochial vicar here at Saint Mary.


