Since I am in the Holy Land as this goes to press, I want to share with you an email. Last week we started singing the Salve Regina as was the custom at my previous parish. After some time of the parish learning

I wanted to tell you how much I love that we sing the Salve Regina after mass. I love that my kids and I know it by heart now.

Today, I had a new reason to love it. We were sitting behind an elderly woman and her adult son. She appeared very infirm and somewhat "not here." He was wonderful to her, finding the music/readings for her, putting his arm around her at times, etc.

He helped her get to communion and back to her seat. Then the Salve started and all of a sudden this beautiful, clear voice rang out—she was singing! I looked up and her son was staring at her with this smiling, gaping, open mouth, just like me, I'm sure. Then her son and I had to stop signing because it's very hard to sing the Salve Regina with a lump in your throat.

We chatted with them after mass and she had a stroke 8 years ago, and doesn't have much short-term memory, but her long-term memory is very solid. She was telling us about being taught by the Dominican nuns in France during her childhood and how they would always sing the Salve in school.

I love how that piece of music ties us to Catholics all over the world, but also to Catholics out of time and place and to Mary. Amazing mass today.

# Give a Student the Gift of a Catholic Education and Gain a Tax Credit

The Virginia Education Improvement Tax Credit Program awards a 65% tax credit to individuals or businesses that make a monetary donation to an approved foundation.

- The Diocese of Arlington Scholarship Foundation is an approved foundation under this program.
- The donation will be used to provide scholarships to low income students to our Catholic schools.
- These donations, in addition to give you, the donor, a tax benefit; it will provide a lifechanging education for our new students.

### Frequently Asked Questions about How to Donate

### Who is eligible for the tax credit?

Any individual or business entity may receive a tax credit for eligible donations.

## What kind of donations qualify for the credit?

Eligible donations include monetary donations by cash, checks, or marketable securities. Donations of goods, services or property are not eligible for the tax credit.

#### How are donations limited?

In order to receive a tax credit, donors must contribute a minimum of \$500. For individuals, including married couples, the eligible maximum donation is \$125,000 per taxable year. Therefore, the maximum credit of an individual's donation is \$81,250 (65% of \$125K). Business entities, including sole proprietorships,

have no maximum donation amount.

### How does a donor apply for a tax credit?

In order to qualify for a tax credit, donors must request pre-authorization from the Department of Education. Donations made without pre-authorization will not be eligible for the tax credit. Pre-authorization requests are processed on a first-come, firstserved basis. Pre-authorization requests will only be granted for the first 25 million dollars in total donations. The Department of Education will issue a preauthorization notice to the donor indicating approval of the donation.

# Follow these steps to get your Tax Credit:

1. Go Online:

www.doe.virginia.gov/school\_finance/scholarships\_tax\_credits to receive your pre-authorization form (approx. 2 weeks' wait).

2. Once your pre-authorization form is received, mail the completed and signed form with a check to:

Diocese of Arlington Scholarship Foundation, 200 North Glebe Road, Suite 811 Arlington, VA 22203

- 3. Please make checks payable to: Diocese of Arlington Scholarship Foundation. If the donation is marketable securities, please contact us for a stock donation form and instructions.
- 4. An acknowledgement letter from the Diocese of Arlington Scholarship Foundation will be sent to you for your tax deduction.
- 5. The State of Virginia will send a tax credit certificate directly to you. The tax credit may be claimed for the same tax year in which the donation is made. Any unused tax credits may be carried over to the next five succeeding tax years or until the total amount of the credit has been taken, whichever is sooner.



# Providing New Opportunities

Last year St. Mary parishioners were asked to consider donating used sewing machines to Catholic Charities Migration and Resettlement (MRS) Office here in Fredericksburg. In all 11 machines were donated and with the help of volunteers, many were refurbished free of charged.

### AED Locations at St. Mary Church And Parish Life Center

An AED (automated external defibrillator) is a lightweight and battery powered piece of medical equipment that can be potentially lifesaving. An AED is used to treat ventricular fibrillation, the most common cause of sudden cardiac arrest. Anyone is a potential victim of sudden cardiac arrest, man or woman, young or old. Survival of a sudden cardiac arrest is related to how quickly a victim is defibrillated. AED units are seen in most public places such as libraries, swimming pools, airports, shopping malls...and St. Mary's.

## St. Mary's has two AED units located in the following areas:

- · Main entrance to the church on the left side of the entrance in the closet opposite the men's restroom.
- $\cdot$  Main floor of the PLC on the wall next to the large Crucifix

These AED units are only lifesaving if people are trained in CPR and AED use. Trained responders are the key to potentially saving another person's life. You too can be a life saver!
