# from the pastor



Dear Folks,

This is a busy Church week. We have the holy day of obligation on Tuesday (All Saints) and the great feast of All Souls on Wednesday. Why are there any holy days?

Why is the feast of All Saints such a big holy day? What does the obligation mean?

**Holy days**: I often say that my life is ruled by Roman Catholic Church Google Calendar, telling me what to do and when to do it. Our Calendars really shape and HOLY CROSS ACADEMY give direction to our lives. What direction is your life headed? Holy days are reminders that the ebb and flow of our lives is directed to heaven. Who has set the biggest days on your calendar this week, God or the world?

**All Saints**: Imagine that your grandmother were to be canonized a saint by Pope Francis. Your friends would all congratulate you, and you would joyfully make arrangements to go to Rome for the Mass and party. We have a feast to celebrate all of the uncanonized saints in heaven (All Saints) and one to pray for all those on the final step there (All Souls). This is the church celebrating your friends and relatives who have gone to God forever. We don't have to go to Rome for the canonization, but can all gather in our parishes to celebrate our loved ones' union with God.

Why obligatory? It flows from the nature of the feast, not from some imperial decree. If we don't celebrate our loved ones, who will? This is a sign of our gratitude to those we love, and our hope for reunion with them one day. It is our love that compels us to attend Mass and worship God for his great work in our families.

### **Blood Pressure Check-In**

The Center for Disease Control and Prevention's, "Know the Facts about High Blood Pressure" one in three Americans has high blood pressure and this condition is within an individual's control. Activities such as food choices we make, maintaining a healthy weight, routine activity level and regular checks of our blood pressure numbers are preventative strategies that are shown to make a significant impact on the development of hypertension. # **Special Collection November 5th & 6th**

The Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS) was established by Saint John Paul II in 1985 to provide the Catholic Church's full range of pastoral ministries to those in the United States Armed Forces. The mission of the Archdiocese is to "serve those who serve" by providing the same pastoral care and services as any other Catholic diocese to Catholics serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, enrolled in in U.S. Military Academies, undergoing treatment at any of the 153 Department of Veterans Affairs' Medical Centers in the U.S., Puerto Rico and Guam, working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders, and the families of these populations. The AMS is the only source of Catholic chaplains for the U.S. military and Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers. All told, the AMS and its endorsed priests and deacons are responsible for pastoral service to approximately 1.8 million Catholics. Unlike a conventional diocese, the AMS has no parishes or parish registries. The AMS has no weekly collections and relies solely on the generosity of private donations to support its programs and services.

Your support of the National Collection for the AMS will bring the Gospel, the sacraments and other forms of spiritual support to men and women who serve our Country and defend our freedoms, including parishioners and families from our own diocese. # help for haiti

### Diocese of Les Cayes, Haiti - Devastated by Hurrican Matthew

In the beginning of July this year, our parish hosted two priests from the Diocese of Les Cayes, Haiti for the annual Mission Appeal for the Diocese. Fathers Coissy and Matthieu spoke about the needs of their diocese, especially their parish Church of Our Lady of Perpetual Help which had been damaged by the earthquake several years ago. We have recently learned that their Diocese took a direct hit from Hurricane Matthew and has suffered much devastation. An excerpt from Father Coissy's recent letter:

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

I am so saddened by what I have to write, regarding the devastating effects of Hurricane Matthew. The center of Cavaillon, as well as its 5 surroundings communes, were hit directly by the hurricane, which caused major damages, especially with the rising of the Cavaillon river which flooded all the town and its surrounding areas. We lost 20 people, adults and children. Churches, Community centers, houses, schools, and hospitals are damaged, or in some case completely destroyed. The Church of Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Cavaillon, which is planning to celebrate its 300th anniversary in 2019, has been very much damaged. The roof is down, some of the walls are cracked, doors and windows broken, and the bell tower cannot hold the church bell. and need to be consolidated very quickly. 9 of the 11 parish "chapelles" are either completely down, or have roofs that are gone, and cracked walls. 3 of our 5 Parish schools have roofs that are gone, cracked walls and windows and doors broken. Because of all the gardens, on the mountains, as well as in the plains,

have been destroyed, food is currently lacking, wells have been damaged, and there is lots of not potable water in the artesian wells. The lack of clean water is bringing forth an extended risk of cholera, malaria, typhoid fever etc. Many houses where our students lived have been destroyed, students have also lost their clothes, their shoes, their books. Reopening of schools is planned for October 18th, but this is a hypothetical date, as most students won't be able to find any food, clothing or money for tuition. We are so alarmed by that situation. We wanted to share it with you. We are with you in prayer and solidarity. (Ignace COISSY Prêtre -Curé de Cavaillon, Vicaire Episcopal *de cette zone Pastorale)*
