There is an election? Who knew? ...and yes that is sarcasm with a smile. Voting is a serious civic duty. This duty requires we have well formed consciences on the social and political issues of the day. To that end, we



are making available a number or resources in IMMACULATE the bulletin beginning with a letter from our CONCEPTION Bishop. Additionally, we are rerunning the Roman Catholic Church novena prayer that we began praying last week. Also the Virginia Catholic Conference is the public policy advocacy organization representing Virginia's two Catholic Bishops. > CELIAC? GLUTEN TOLERANCE ISSUES? Folks, I am interested in knowing how many folks we have in the parish whose bodies are gluten intolerant and therefore unable to consume a eucharistic host. While the transubstantiated host is no longer bread, but the Body of Christ, it still retains the chemical properties of bread and therefore gluten. I recently spoke with a family whose sensitivity is so significant that they can't even consume the 'low-gluten' hosts because of the possible 'contamination' of crumbs from the hands of the priest who have immediately prior handled full-gluten hosts. Similarly, some are unable to consume from a chalice after someone who has consumed a host for the same reason. Even the smallest of crumbs can cause serious physical

If you are affected by this, would you please email me (frmosimann@stmaryfred. org)? That would be of great assistance so that I might discuss with the priests how we can accommodate your needs and then communicate to you the decided upon process. pax,




## \$10,000 Donation to Holy Cross Academy Expansion Fund



Activities such as food choices we make, maintaining a healthy weight, routine activity level and regular checks of our blood pressure numbers are preventative strategies that are shown to make a significant impact on the development of hypertension. By knowing and keeping track of your blood pressure numbers, you can alert your primary care physician to potential problems and make necessary changes. The Health Ministry Team at St. Mary is here to help! They will be providing a quarterly Blood Pressure Check-In for those 18 yrs & older from 8:30am-Noon in Rm 100 in the **Parish Life Center.** Stop into the Sunday Coffee Shop and get your BP checked before your coffee & donut! This Check-in will be facilitated by a nurse and parishioners will be given a written record of the findings and resource materials will be available. Come join the Health Ministry Team in taking positive steps to better health and well-being. 
