Dear Folks,

This weekend we have the blessing of a dozen new altar servers which is always an inspiration to see the enthusiasm with which they undertake this service. Let me share with you a story of a young man serving at the altar. His mother asked me if he could go through the training, despite his only being in third grade. And so he did with great enthusiasm. Over the course of his first year, he couldn't stand still, would fidget, and sometimes when holding the missal it was impossible for me to read. As the next years training arrived, I thought, "never again a third grader...too much of a distraction." But the next day his mother came to me and told me this: He had just had a dream. He was in the church with me, dressed in his 'priest clothes,' fighting off the 'bad guys' who were trying to attack Jesus. She also related that on their 3 hour drive to Grandma's, he would pray the rosary non-stop. She thanked me for being a positive influence on her son.

This was 10 years ago. Now this young man is joining the marines. Despite his family moving across the country, we have kept in contact, and he was excited to let me know how his life journey is progressing.

Being a pastor means being a spiritual father. I thank God for the privilege of serving you in this way, and look forward to the graces that God will work in our lives together.

Because altar serving has long been connected with promoting vocations, I want to continue to emphasize this. St. Mary's is blessed with very capable female altar servers. In order to make the vocational encouragement even more explicit, we are going to add a black scapular to the vesture that female altar servers wear. This is being done to visually make the connection with the religious life to which young ladies are called. Boys will still dress like priests, girls like religious sisters.

If you were at the server installation ceremony today (10:30am), you also noticed another way to make the connection more explicit. Each of the male servers was vested by me with their surplice, while Sister Susan Louise vested the female servers with the scapular. It is an important day for each as they embark on this journey of service, and I am hopeful they will remember this day with joy.

Please encourage vocations. Generous prayer, faithfulness, and service are the fertilizer that make vocations grow in our families.

# Sister Frances Carol Eder

Sr. Frances Carol Eder is a 6th grade teacher at Holy Cross Academy with a specialty in science. She is one of our three Oblate Sisters of St. Francis de Sales assigned to St. Mary. She professed her final vows on August 28, 1987. Sister was influenced mostly through the daily example and strong faith of her family. She was also encouraged within her family to look for and pursue where God would call her to serve Him. Most people in this parish are aware that there are three of them within her family who are Religious Sisters, all Oblate Sisters. In her family there are also two brothers and one more sister. Sr. Frances Carol likes to say hers was a loving and caring family which enjoyed being together, cherishing each other, and living a joy-filled life. Their family was rooted in the faith of the Catholic Church and her parents taught them through example how to be people living and developing morals and values that have formed them today. In addition to being assigned to St. Mary and Holy Cross Academy, she has been assigned to the main house of the Oblate Sisters in Childs, Maryland and their school-Mount Aviat Academy. She has also taught Religious Education at Sacred Heart Parish in Oxford, PA and Immaculate Conception Parish while living and teaching in Maryland. When asked what the best part of being an Oblate Sister is she said " to be there for so many who are in need and to feel that I am doing God's will in serving Him daily." As far as advice for young people discerning their vocation she advises them to "be willing to take the risk and just do it. Many who have vocations never accept the vocation call. It really is a matter of asking God to show you what his will is and then listen to what he is saying and follow his will." Sr. Frances Carol's favorite prayer is one she does daily in praying the Liturgy of the Hours. As she says this prayer, she realizes that throughout the world it is being said 24 hours a day. It is a universal prayer and unities her with so many throughout the world. She also really enjoys the Psalms which are recited daily with the Liturgy of the Hours. We at St. Mary and Holy Cross Academy are very blessed to have Sr. Frances Carol in our parish and school. She has a wonderful sense of humor, is very adventurous and is such a wonderful role model for all the children. Thank you Sister for all the gifts you share with our school and parish!

# Be sure to watch

**"Guadalupe: The Miracle and the Message" before December 12**, feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Learn more about one of Mary's apparitions and how it converted a people and changed their culture from a culture of death to a culture of life. There is also a Spanish version.

The most important event in the evangelization of the New World occurred in December, 1531. Over the course of four days, the Virgin Mary, under the title of Our Lady of Guadalupe, appeared to an indigenous convert named Juan Diego. As a result of this encounter, and the image miraculously imprinted on Juan Diego's tilma (cloak), nine million Native Americans embraced the Catholic faith, and the Americas began its transformation into the Catholic hemisphere. Our Lady of Guadalupe s message of love had replaced the institutionalized violence of the Aztec culture and built a bridge between two worlds.

*Guadalupe: The Miracle and the Message* traces the history of this transformative event from the 16th century to the present. Featuring interviews with leading theologians, historians and experts on the scientific inquiries into the miraculous image this gripping film explores both the inexplicable mysteries behind the image, and the continued relevance of the Guadalupe apparition to the modern world.

The Fredericksburg Office of Catholic Charities, located next to the Parish, provides Family Counseling Services for Fredericksburg and the surrounding counties. Many times the children and adolescents who come in for counseling are in financial need, and contributions from our parish will be used to assist with the financial cost of their counseling.

# Annual Report of St. Vincent de Paul Society of St. Mary and St. Jude
