Summer's Around the Corner

As the school year gets closer to the end, teachers find creative ways to motivate our students to continue learning. Many of these activities include applying the math and science principles that the students have been learning all year.

Holy Cross first graders look forward to welcoming chicks into their classroom each year. They learned all about their development as the eggs sat in the incubator for twenty-one long days. They sang to the emerging chicks in both English and Spanish to encourage them along. Finally the first tiny cracks appeared and soon our first grade classes were filled with high pitched chirps and peeps. Before handing the chicks over to the farmer, the children learned how to hold them and speak to them gently. Students and teachers from all over the school stopped in to visit the chicks and see the beautiful smiles on the faces of our first graders.

Sixth grade students in Honors Math created original robots and calculated the surface area of each one. The project was a lot of fun and taught the students how to solve real life multi-step problems.

Sixth graders in the Science Squad terminated their study of the environment and biomes with presentations to students in all grades. These students chose to stay after school once a week since September to investigate this area of scientific study. Their presentations were very well received and allowed students throughout the school to share in all they had learned.


Last Week of Religious Education Classes
