In handling cases regarding the declaration of the nullity of a marriage, Pope Francis indicates that "care is to be taken that everyone ... can participate in the process at a minimum of cost" (Apostolic Letter Mitis iudex, art. 7, para. 2). Following a review of our existing annulment processes and upon appropriate consultation, I have determined there will be no fee or suggested .donation for the services rendered in the Diocese of Arlington by the Office for Canonical Affairs and the Tribunal.

This policy will be effective July 1, 2017, and will be conveyed via the Catholic Herald and social media.




