


> Lord several years ago; may he rest in peace and reap the rewards of the lives he touched.

Anointing of the Sick During Mass

Saturday July 8 at 9am

We will have what is commonly called a "healing Mass," where the Sacrament of the Sick is offered during Mass. The Sacrament of the Sick is one of the Church's seven sacraments instituted by Christ and referred to in James 5:14-15. As an "outward sign of an inward grace," it is a Sacrament in which oil, blessed during the Chrism Mass by the Bishop, is used as the "vehicle" for the Holy Spirit to work in the soul of the sick person, so that the sick person can be more closely united to Christ in His sufferings, gaining strength, extra graces for the good of souls, peace, and possibly, healing of the body. It is a joy to be able to offer this Sacrament during the Mass, as it gives us great hope before the great mystery of human suffering by uniting our suffering to the mysteries of the Incarnation and our redemption.

Since the Sacrament of the Sick will be offered at Mass, it is important to note that the Sacrament can only confer grace on those who are "seriously sick."

The General Introduction to the Pastoral Care of the Sick states that, "Those of the faithful whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age receive this Sacrament." (GIPCS 8)

the Sacrament may be repeated if (a) the person recovers then falls ill again or (b) the condition becomes more serious (for example, a new, more grave diagnosis is given). (GIPCS 9)

The Sacrament is also appropriate before surgery and for the elderly who have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present." (GIPCS 10, 11)

Diagnosed addictions or diagnosed psychiatric conditions may be considered "serious illness."

Receiving the Sacrament of the Sick would NOT be appropriate in the cases of:

-a common illness like the cold or flu

-subjectively diagnosed conditions, mental or physcial (common sense should dictate what "serious illness" means; if there is doubt, a priest or a doctor should be consulted) -a general feeling of illness -an undiagnosed, suspected psychological condition

It is our hope that we continually strive to draw closer to Our Saviour, above all we draw closer to Our Savior, and that this be a means of doing so. May God bless you.

This fund was created in 2005 to help the families of service members who come to McGuire Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Richmond with traumatic brain injuries and spinal-cord injuries from combat in Iraq and Afghanistan. Former Army Captain William Haneke, a wounded Vietnam Veteran, and some colleagues recognized the need to assist family members who were away from home tending to their loved ones when they saw two young mothers with babies arrive from across the country with no money and barely enough gas to make the trip. The organization gives 100 percent of all tax-deductible donations to the families to help with food, lodging, transportation, child care, diapers and long-distance calling cards during the many weeks a family is in the Richmond area, and each family currently receives \$7,500.00.
