
Celebrating 20 Years!

Food for Families School Food Pantry

The mission of the School Food Pantry program is to help alleviate child hunger for families in crisis. School-based pantries are located on the grounds of a school to provide a more readily accessible source of emergency food assistance to students and their families. As a need is identified by school staff, the prepacked boxes containing a few days of emergency food, along with resource materials such as a pantry reference list and SNAP information, are distributed to the families in need.

Club Kids

This structured after-school snack program provides nutrition among at-risk children, ages 4-18 years, in an environment that is safe, accessible, and convenient. Over 3,000 kids are being fed monthly at sites throughout our service area. Sites are located at schools, faithbased organizations, the Boys and Girls Club.

Club Kids II

Like Kids Club, this structured after-school snack program provides nutrition among at-risk children, ages 4-18 years, and are enrolled in a participating after-

school program. The mission of Club Kids II is to provide nutritious, freshly prepared snacks to children in an environment that is safe, accessible, and convenient. Sites are located at organizations that provide after-school programming for youth such as the Boys and Girls Club, Hazel Hill & Heritage Park.

Kids on the Go Summer Feeding

"Kids on the Go" is a program of the Fredericksburg Regional Food Bank which provides children attending summer school or other summer enrichment programs with a healthy prepared meal. Kids on the Go helps to alleviate childhood hunger by bridging the hunger gap when reliable sources of food may not be available. Children 18 years of age and younger are welcome to receive a free, freshly prepared, well-balanced meal, at any of our sponsored sites.
