Religious Education, CCD or Faith Formation - lots of names for the same task, teaching the content of our faith to our children. This weekend at all Masses we will be commissioning the Catechists who will be sharing the faith with our future generations. We must use our best talents and energies to hand on that which is most important. I recently saw this quote from Pope Benedict in the Forward to YouCat (the youth catechism):

Study the Catechism!
This is my heartfelt desire.
Study the catechism
with passion and perseverance.
Study it in the quiet of your room;
read it with a friend;
form study groups and networks;
share with each other on the Internet....
You need to be more deeply rooted in the faith
than the generation of your parents...

The line that most caught my eye was the last, about being "more deeply rooted in the faith than the generation of your parents." This made me think, "Wow, strong words B16!" But it also evoked the sentiment that I often hear, "I just want to give my kids better than I had growing up." Really, it ends up being very revelatory of what the new parents value. Unfortunately, when I ask for some specifics the list usually ends up being financial, emotional, and educational, but almost never spiritual. We all have limited time, talent, energy, and resources. Are we handing on a fuller expression of the faith so that our children will be even more deeply rooted than we are? That should be our goal!

I want to especially thank those who teach and are aides to the Religious Education department, I know that they are pouring out their time, talents, and energy into this task. Thank you for your willingness to teach profess, live, and teach our faith!

What is a Life Chain?

The first Life Chain, born through prayer, was built in 1987 by Please Let Me Live, a small pro-life ministry in Yuba City,

California. From its small beginning, the Life Chain has grown to over 1,800 Life Chains in the United States and Canada, and is a call to the Christian Church to mobilize against an abortion holocaust that claims over one million American lives annually, and has claimed over sixty million lives worldwide, through surgical abortion. The Life Chain is a peaceful, prayerful, silent demonstration. Hundreds of Christians - clergy and lay people -- stand 25 to 50 feet apart to form a prayer chain and hold signs reading Abortion Kills Children, Jesus Forgives and Heals, Adoption: The Loving Option, Lord, Forgive Us and Our Nation, Life: The First Inalienable Right. This powerful, visual impact not only raises community awareness but has also been credited with saving children's lives. Consider the words of Pope John Paul II who said, "When life before birth is attacked, we will stand up. No one ever has the authority to destroy unborn human life."

St. Mary Parish will again participate in the Annual Life Chain on **Sunday**, **October 1** and welcomes all our parishioners and local churches as well. **We will meet in the Parish Life Center at 2pm** to pick up our signs and walk up to Route 1, where we will form a chain along Route 1 from Route 3 to College Avenue. *Please join us and take a stand for the unborn*.



Council 4034 Bowling League



5-Gallon bucket with resealable lid

- •Buckets from fast-food restaurants or bakeries can be used if washed and cleaned
- Do not use buckets that have stored chemicals such as paint or pool cleaner
- Advertisements on the outside are acceptable

Liquid laundry detergent

•One 50-oz. or two 25-oz. bottle(s) only

Liquid household cleaner

- 12-16oz. liquid cleaner that can be mixed with water
- No spray cleaners

Dish soap

•16-28 oz. bottle any brand

1 can air freshener

Aerosol or pump

1 insect repellant spray

• 6-14oz. aerosol or spray pump w/ protective cover

Assembly Directions

Place all liquid items in the bucket first. Place remaining items in the bucket, fitting them around and between the liquid items. Sponges, scouring pads, clothespins, and trash bags can be separated in order to fit all of the items in the bucket. Ensure the lid is closed securely.

Important Notes

- If all of the items on the list are not included, please put a label on the bucket indicating what has been omitted.
- All items must be new except for the actual bucket and lid.
- All cleaning agents must be liquid and in plastic containers.
- No powders, please.
- If you cannot find the requested size of a liquid item, use a smaller size. Including larger sizes of any item will prevent the lid from sealing.


