Dear Folks,

I hope our Arctic days are over.

You might say, "huh?"

If you didn't notice the Arctic chill sweeping the cry-room, narthex and sacristy, then give thanks

Over the last several weeks, some zones of the church have reached temperatures usually reserved for the Arctic Circle. (Yes, that is hyperbole). Several efforts were unable to diagnose the cause of the problem. And thanks to the folks who texted me pictures of people of the to the folks who texted me pictures of pec IMMACULATE standing outside to avoid the Arctic chill.

So finally this week, with a return call to our Heating and A/C vendor, the problem was found. The Boiler used to heat the church had shut down, and was not restarting.

You might say "why would that matter?" Because the system is constructed in such a way, that the Air Conditioning Chiller serves not only to cool the church but also to dehumidify. It is important to keep the church humidity within a measured range because of all of the wood and most especially the organ. Thus, when humidity is high the air conditioner will continue to run in order to remove moisture, even if the church is already cold! At such times (high humidity, church cold), the boiler will also kick in to reheat the air in order to return the dry air to a comfortable temperature. Hence, our Arctic chill because the air was chilled to remove humidity, but was not being reheated. Now that we know better the design principle behind the system, we will be able to better diagnose issues should they arise in the future.

You might (as I did) say, "Isn't that a horribly wasteful way to dehumidify?"

Our contractor agreed that it is a energy inefficient way to solve the humidity problem, but one that is very commonly used for large buildings because of its simple design. It is the way that our heating, cooling, dehumidifying was designed. Further analysis might consider the cost of adding a dedicated dehumidifier, and what energy savings would result from such a capital investment, but that is for another day.

Just in case you wanted to know why.

The Life Chain is a peaceful, prayerful, silent demonstration. Hundreds of Christians clergy and lay people -- stand 25 to 50 feet apart to form a prayer chain and hold signs reading Abortion Kills Children, Jesus Forgives and Heals, Adoption: The Loving Option, Lord, Forgive Us and Our Nation, Life: The First Inalienable Right. This powerful, visual impact not only raises community awareness but has also been credited with saving children's lives. Consider the words of Pope John Paul II who said, "When life before birth is attacked, we will stand up. No one ever has the authority to destroy unborn human life."

St. Mary Parish will again participate in the Annual Life Chain on Sunday, October 1 and welcomes all our parishioners and local churches as well. We will meet in the Parish Life Center at 2pm to pick up our signs and walk up to Route 1, where we will form a chain along Route 1 from Route 3 to College Avenue. *Please join us and* take a stand for the unborn.

Second Grade Happenings!

Last week the children explored math tools on their way to becoming mathematicians! After their hands on activity with the balances and other manipulatives, they created a word wall, working together to decide which tools would be used in different professions. They imagined themselves as bankers, boat captains, and civil engineers, just to name a few.

After watching a video of the flooding in Houston, third grade students talked about the effects the flood waters have on people's homes. They brainstormed ideas to create a barrier to protect homes from flooding and then created them in teams of four. The materials they used included craft sticks, play dough, aluminum foil, tape, foam sheets, and pipe cleaners. A small red cup represented the house. To test the barriers, they poured water into the bin that contained the house and barrier.

Their ideas were amazing. Two groups came up with creating structures that made the house float. When their teacher extended the lesson by asking what the problem with that would be in real life, they said the house would bump into things as it floated away. Continuing to work on the problem, they decided to anchor the floation device to the ground so it would still float but would not end up in the next town.

To round out the experience, the children wrote reflections on the process, what worked and what didn't, and the improvements they could make. They also reflected on the experience of working in a team.

Our students are excited to work on more problems this year and to discover new ways of learning.



- Do not use buckets that have stored chemicals such as paint or pool cleaner
- Advertisements on the outside are acceptable

Liquid laundry detergent

•One 50-oz. or two 25-oz. bottle(s) only

- 12-16oz. liquid cleaner that can be mixed with water
- No spray cleaners

- If all of the items on the list are not included, please put a label on the bucket indicating what has been omitted.
- All items must be new except for the actual bucket and lid.
- All cleaning agents must be liquid and in plastic containers.
- No powders, please.
- If you cannot find the requested size of a liquid item, use a smaller size. Including larger sizes of any item will prevent the lid from sealing.


