

National Life Chain Sunday - Oct. 1 Annual Life Chain 2- 3:30pm

#### What is a Life Chain?

The first Life Chain, born through prayer, was built in 1987 by Please Let Me Live, a small pro-life ministry in Yuba City, California. From its small beginning, the Life Chain has grown to over 1,800 Life Chains in the United States and Canada, and is a call to the Christian Church to mobilize against an abortion holocaust that claims over one million American lives annually, and has claimed over sixty million lives worldwide, through surgical abortion. The Life Chain is a peaceful, prayerful, silent demonstration. Hundreds of Christians clergy and lay people -- stand 25 to 50 feet apart to form a prayer chain and hold signs reading Abortion Kills Children, Jesus Forgives and Heals, Adoption: The Loving Option, Lord, Forgive Us and Our Nation, Life: The First Inalienable Right. This powerful, visual impact not only raises community awareness but has also been credited with saving children's lives. Consider the words of Pope John Paul II who said, "When life before birth is attacked, we will stand up. No one ever has the authority to destroy unborn human life."

St. Mary Parish will again participate in the Annual Life Chain on Sunday, October 1 and welcomes all our parishioners and local churches as well. We will meet in the Parish Life Center at 2pm to pick up our signs and walk up to Route 1, where we will form a chain along Route 1 from Route 3 to College Avenue. Please join us and take a stand for the unborn.

#### Chapter 1:

## The Importance and Dignity of the Celebration of the Eucharist

"16. The celebration of Mass, as the action of Christ and of the People of God arrayed hierarchically, is the center of the whole of Christian life for the Church both universal and local, as well as for each of the faithful individually. For in it is found the high point both of the action by which God sanctifies the world in Christ and of the worship that the human race offers to the Father, adoring him through Christ, the Son of God, in the Holy Spirit. In it, moreover, during the course of the year, the mysteries of redemption are celebrated so as to be in some way made present. As to the other sacred actions and all the activities of the Christian life, these are bound up with it, flow from it, and are ordered to it.

17. It is, therefore, of the greatest importance that the celebration of the Mass or the Lord's Supper be so ordered that the sacred ministers and the faithful taking part in it, according to the state proper to each, may draw from it more abundantly those fruits, to obtain which, Christ the Lord instituted the Eucharistic Sacrifice of his Body and Blood and entrusted it as the memorial of his Passion and Resurrection to the Church, his beloved Bride."

# WHAT'S IN A FLOOD BUCKET KIT

## 5-Gallon bucket with resealable lid

- •Buckets from fast-food restaurants or bakeries can be used if washed and cleaned
- Do not use buckets that have stored chemicals such as paint or pool cleaner
- Advertisements on the outside are acceptable

## Liquid laundry detergent

•One 50-oz. or two 25-oz. bottle(s) only

# Liquid household cleaner

- 12-16oz. liquid cleaner that can be mixed with water
- No spray cleaners

#### Dish soap

•16-28 oz. bottle any brand

## 1 can air freshener

Aerosol or pump

# 1 insect repellant spray

• 6-14oz. aerosol or spray pump w/ protective cover

#### 1 scrub brush

• Plastic or wooden handle

## 7 sponges

- •No cellulose sponges due to mold issues
- Remove from wrapper

# 5 scouring pads

- Remove from wrapper
- •No stainless steel, Brillo pads, or SOS pads (nothing with soap built in)

# 50 clothespins

### Clothesline

- •One 100-ft, or two 50-ft, lines
- Cotton or plastic

## 24-roll heavy-duty trash bags

- •33- to 45-gallon sizes
- Remove from the box

#### 5 dust masks

# 2 pairs kitchen dishwashing gloves

- •Should be durable enough for multiple uses
- Remove from packaging

# 1 pair work gloves

Cotton with leather palm or all leather

#### 18 cleaning wipes

- Handi Wipes or reusable wipes
- No terry cleaning towels
- Remove from packaging

# **Assembly Directions**

Place all liquid items in the bucket first. Place remaining items in the bucket, fitting them around and between the liquid items. Sponges, scouring pads, clothespins, and trash bags can be separated in order to fit all of the items in the bucket. Ensure the lid is closed securely.

#### **Important Notes**

- If all of the items on the list are not included, please put a label on the bucket indicating what has been omitted.
- All items must be new except for the actual bucket and lid.
- All cleaning agents must be liquid and in plastic containers.
- No powders, please.
- If you cannot find the requested size of a liquid item, use a smaller size. Including larger sizes of any item will prevent the lid from sealing.
