

St. Mary Church welcomes our new Director of Music and Organist David Uschold. A native of the Cleveland, Ohio area, Mr. Uschold comes to us from Holy Family Catholic Church, Parma, Ohio, where for the past eleven years, he held the posi-

tion of Director of Music and Liturgy. He led a comprehensive program of choirs, cantors and musicians as well as all liturgical aspects of the church. Prior to Holy Family, David served Ridge Road United Church



of Christ, Parma, Ohio, Fairmount Presbyterian Church, Cleveland Heights, Ohio and Nativity of the Lord Jesus Catholic Church, Akron, Ohio. In addition to his responsibilities at St. Mary, he continues a performance career as an organist as well as a vocalist and is a member of the vocal ensemble Contrapunctus.

In 2001, David was first-place winner of the American Guild of Organist's Regional Competition for Young Organist at the Chapter Level and in past years has also been awarded several awards for excellence in church music and organ performance from various organizations. He holds Bachelor and Master of Music degrees in organ from the Cleveland Institute of Music where he studied organ and church music with organ virtuoso Todd Wilson.

On Friday, October 20, at 8pm, David will present a concert as part of the St. Mary Concert Art Series. Students Helping Others & Learning

Our Holy Cross Academy families donated generously to help the victims of the hurricanes. Our students participated in the National Catholic Education Association's Student-to- Student campaign with donations totaling \$864.36. Along with our gifts of money, we are praying for all the victims of the hurricanes and those who are working to help them recover and rebuild. We want to "Shine the Light of Jesus's love on the victims of the hurricanes."

For these past few weeks, our 3rd graders have been learning about the Water Cycle and how important it is to conserve and clean our water supply. Students learned that many things, such as erosion, fertilizers, oil, litter, salt, and soap, contribute to polluting our waterways and aquatic life. The students worked in groups to create a plan for filtering "polluted" water that we created for the lesson. They then engineered their own water filtration systems and determined which materials best cleaned the water.

Down the hall, our 5th graders were creating suspension bridges. Using everyday materials, they designed and constructed bridges that could serve as prototypes for the future.


