National Hispanic Heritage Month

During National Hispanic Heritage Month, our students recognized the contributions made and the important presence of Hispanic and Latino Americans to the United States as they celebrated their heritage and culture. Our 6th graders worked on projects about Spanish-speaking countries. They learned about location, capitals, additional languages, typical food and lots of intriguing facts. For instance, do you know that Mexico City is sinking every day, due to the water use?


