

How do you celebrate Advent? I re-read a blog post titled, "Baby steps for celebrating Advent: 24 super simple ideas." Google it, and you should be able to find it on ConversionDiary.com. I liked how practical these recommendations are for families. Advent wreaths, Nativity sets, special Advent books for children. Little traditions like these in your own home go a long, long way to connecting with children and demonstrating that the faith is not a 'Sunday-Only' proposition. I recall how my family had a special area where Christmas presents would be piled up during the weeks that led to Christmas. I loved to lie on the floor and stare at them and dream of what might be behind the wrapping paper. And when I could get my gifts wrapped and added to the pile, my smile only got bigger. Advent wreath praying might be hit-or-miss some years, but we were still committed to it as a family, despite the many distractions and trials of scheduling big families. And I often consider that my parents 'forcing' me to participate in those prayers, even leading them sometimes, taught me how to be comfortable praying in public and leading others in prayers. Seeds planted for my vocation.

A reminder that this Friday is our patron feast and Holy Day of Obligation for the feast of the Immaculate Conception. Mass times are in the bulletin here. Of special note is a 7:30pm Mass on Friday the 8th will be a candlelight Mass like our advent ones. A kindly reminder that to miss Mass on a Sunday and Holy Days is a precept that binds every Catholic, and to deliberately fail this obligation is matter for grave sin (CCC 2180-83).

I pray that this Advent will be a season of great prayer for you and your families....

#### Catholic Charities Helps Ex-offenders Get Back On Their Feet

Arlington Diocesan Catholic Charities is helping ex-offenders returning to their communities after incarceration. Sadly many re-offend and return to prison within three years of their release. Part of the problem is their lack of connection with their community. The heart of the Catholic Charities Welcome Home Re-Entry Program is helping ex-offenders establish that connection. The program "seeks to reduce recidivism, educate the community, and develop strong systems of support by building relationships and matching returning individuals with compassionate volunteer mentors".

Through the program, the returning citizens are assigned a trained mentor to help with different areas such as housing, transportation, employment and how to stay sober. Sally O'Dwyer, director of volunteers for Catholic Charities, said 10 mentors have been trained, but they are in need of more. Mentors will work with individuals and determine their needs, but Catholic Charities wants to have a team approach. "Once the mentor is able to find out what the needs are, we try and work as a team to identify resources to help the mentor to be successful by stepping in when needed," said O'Dwyer. Connecting the ex-offender with a faith component also is important. The program will help them get to a church meeting or service of their choice to encourage that development of their faith.

## Advent and Christmas Scheduling Quirks

As we prepare to enter the Season of Advent, many are already beginning their Christmas planning, Saint Mary included! This year, the Fourth Sunday of Advent falls on Sunday, December 24, and, as always, Christmas falls on December 25. This creates a situation that is a little confusing when it comes to determining when we should go to Mass. We are obligated to attend Mass twice between December 23 and December 25: Once for the Fourth Sunday of Advent and once for Christmas. There is not one Mass that satisfies the requirement for both (no two for ones!). In short, Fourth Sunday of Advent is celebrated started at 5pm Mass on Saturday December 23 and ending at 12:30pm on December 24. Christmas begins a few hours later on Sunday, December 24, at the 4pm Mass. That means that to satisfy your obligations for both the Fourth Sunday of Advent and for Christmas, you need to attend Mass for the

Fourth Sunday of Advent at any of the following times: Saturday, December 23rd at 5pm in the church and an additional Mass added for that Saturday only at 5pm at Holy Cross **Academy**, and there will also be a 7pm Vigil in the church which will be bi-lingual. On Sunday Morning, we will have Mass at 7am, 8:30am, 10:30am in the church, and 10:30am at Holy Cross Academy, and 12:30pm in the church. That means the last Mass satisfying your obligation for the Fourth Sunday of Advent is the 12:30pm Mass. Christmas is such an important Solemnity that as soon at the evening approaches we begin celebrating it, so it takes precedence over what would be our normal Sunday evening Masses. Masses for Christmas begin at 4pm, both in the church and at Holy Cross. The 6:30pm Mass in the church will be in Spanish, and the 6:30pm at Holy Cross will be in English. We will have a 8:30pm in the church in English, and caroling at 11pm followed by **Midnight** 

Mass at 12am. On Monday, Christmas morning, we will have 7am, 8:30am, 10:30am, and 12:30pm Mass all in the church.

This year, The Solemnity of Mary Mother of God is NOT a Holy Day of Obligation. This means that, while still a holy day, you are **not** obligated to attend Mass on Monday January 1. You still are obligated to attend on Sunday December 31, the Feast of the Holy Family, at our usual Saturday Vigil or Sunday Mass Schedule. On that Monday, January 1, we will be offering at 7am, 8:30am, 10:30am, 12:30pm, and 2:30pm Spanish for those who still wish to celebrate the Holy Day and start the New Year off with Mass.


