

### from our pastor

Dear Folks, Flu Concerns:

Recently I have had discussion with staff and parishioners about concerns with the current year's flu. I have also gotten updates from CDC via several parishioners. Also this weeks diocesan newspaper is running an article about these changes, a statement from the diocesan liturgy office is expected any day. Thus I want you to know that I am consulting with parish council this week, and will let you know of conclusions promptly. According to the CDC "influenza viruses are spread when a person who has the flu coughs, sneezes, or speaks and spreads virus into the air, and other people inhale the virus.... The viruses can also be spread when a person touches a surface with flu viruses on it (for example, a door handle) and then touches his or her nose or mouth." Here is what the CDC recommends to prevent the flu: "Avoid close contact with people who are sick. When you are sick, keep your distance from others to protect them from getting sick too; stay home when you are sick. If possible, stay home from work, school, and errands when you are sick. You will help prevent others from catching your illness; cover your mouth and nose. Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing. It may prevent those around you from getting sick; clean your hands. Washing your hands often will help protect you from germs. Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs are often spread when a person touches something that is contaminated with germs and then touches his or her eyes, nose, or mouth."

**Drinking from the Chalices** — this is an option. I am considering offering communion only under the form of the consecrated host. However, I am most mindful of the people in the parish who only receive from the chalice because of Gluten sensitivities. I want you to be prepared that we may be suspending communion from the chalice in the near future.

However, even now please remember that drinking from the chalice is an option at some Masses. If you or someone in your household is sick, then please refrain from drinking from the chalice. It is a simple act of charity to your neighbors and possibly yourself because of possible re-infection with other germs while your immune system is weakened.

**Sign of peace** — this is also an optional rite. Many people very much appreciate this rite on a regular basis, however it is explicitly permissible for the priest to omit this rite from the celebration of the Mass. If I reach the point that this seems to be prudent it will be communicated to you via announcement and in the bulletin.

However, even now, know that there is not requirement to shake hands at this time. It is perfectly acceptable to substitute a bow, a smile, or other appropriate gesture in place of a handshake at the sign of peace. Especially if one has been coughing or sneezing this is actually an act of kindness for your neighbor. The fact that someone extends their hand out of habit does not mean that it is rude to simply smile and say "peace be with you" while not extending your hand. This is actually okay at any time that anyone is sick, not just in this time of flu concerns. If someone does not return your handshake, then do not presume that they are rude, rather presume that they are kindly trying to avoid giving you the flu.

One of the challenges here is that, according to the CDC, "adults can be contagious from one day before developing symptoms to up to seven days after getting sick. Children can be contagious for longer than seven days." Thus the apparent health of someone does not mean that they are not contagious.

**Mass attendance** — clearly when one is sick there is no moral obligation to attend Sunday Mass. The Catechism of the Catholic Church expresses this thus, "the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on days of obligation, unless excused for a serious reason (for example, illness, the care of infants) or dispensed by their own pastor." Especially if you are ill and contagious it is not sinful to miss Mass, but it may rather be an act of charity to stay home. Pray the rosary, watch a televised Mass in order to make the day Holy.

**Other practical Measures** — Anti-germ wipes are helpful, wash your hands when you return from Mass and other public spaces, and always be kind. Finally, when exiting from Mass, if you might be contagious you don't have to shake the priest's hands! We won't begrudge you a simple nod or wink!



### **Concerts at St. Mary**

On Friday, February 9 at 8pm, Concerts at St. Mary will present soprano Aani Bourassa in a concert of repertoire for soprano, orchestra and organ. Ms. Bourassa will be joined by some of Fredericksburg's finest instrumentalists and Baltimore based organist Alec Davis, all under the direction of St. Mary's Director of Music and Organist David Uschold.

Praised for her "brilliant, yet sparkling high notes" (Burlington Hawkeye), American soprano Aani Bourassa is indeed a versatile actress of emotional depth whose repertoire encompasses Johann Sebastian Bach, Handel, Mozart, opera, French art song, lieder

and oratorio. Some notable roles include Fiordiligi in Mozart's Così fan tutte, Juliette in Charles Gounod's Roméo et Juliette and Lydia in Second Nature by Matthew Aucoin. Ms. Bourassa is also equally prevalent in the concert and sacred music scenes. She has performed solos in works such as Beethoven's Symphony No. 9, Bach's Magnificat and So-drumming by Steve Reich. This summer, Bourassa will return for her fourth season as Artist in Residence at the Ad Astra Music Festival in Kansas. While in residence, she will perform the part of Peitho in the festival's production of Here Be Sirens by Kate Soper and one of the soprano parts in an exciting one-on-a-part performance of Matthäus-Passion by Johann Sebastian Bach. Ms. Bourassa performs regularly with Songs by Heart, a foundation that seeks to enhance the life of the memory impaired through music therapy. Aani Bourassa is a champion of new and undiscovered music, and is currently involved in a collaborative project with pianist Samuel Gingher

> to rediscover and record the vocal works of composer Carl Czerny. In addition to her busy performance career, Ms. Bourassa hold the position of producer and project manager for the recording label Acis Productions.

The Friday evening's program, which is themed in the anticipation of

Lent, will include performances of Purcell's An Evening Hymn, aria How Beautiful Are Thy Feet from Handel's Messiah and two works of Johann Sebastian Bach: Fantasia and Fugue in c minor, S. 537, performed by organist David Uschold, and Cantata 199: Mein Herze schwimmt im Blut for soprano, orchestra and organ. Admission to the concert is free and a free-will offering will be taken to support future Concerts at St. Mary productions. Following the concert there will be a reception in the church's Parish Life Center where there will be an opportunity to meet the performers and share fellowship with others.


#### Suicide — YES, Let's Talk About it Community Resource

Potential suicide – not a welcome topic for most, but think back. How often has someone close to you mentioned that they are feeling sad or discouraged – even hopeless? How did you respond?

This is a very tough topic for most of us, but be assured, your presence, a non-judgmental ear, a loving prayer partner, and a safe community resource may save that family, that person from the tragedy of suicide. In the Fredericksburg area last year 50 people died by suicide. Add to that the family and friends affected by that death and we can count 100s affected. The good news is there are community resources available to you and me, simple lay people, who find ourselves at the edge of these tragedies. Our area's Community Service Board provides regular training in a process called Mental Health First Aide. This program teaches lay people how to respond to a mental health crisis – like CPR has trained folks to respond to cardiac problems. That knowledge can save a life.

#### Lenten Small Groups: Prayer, Finding Intimacy with God

Whereas Lenten Friends is no longer producing the small group programs in which we have participated in the past, this year we will use a program offered through FORMED, an on-line resource already available to St. Mary's. The program is entitled: *Prayer*, *Finding Intimacy with God*.

Though prayer is one of the essentials of a thriving faith, we often feel as if we're talking to ourselves—or, worse, as if we're talking to no one at all. How can something so vital to the Faith be so elusive? Now, with the clear teaching and artistry of the Augustine Institute's Lectio series, Dr. Tim *Gray masterfully uses the disci*pline of Lectio Divina to show you how to make prayer an effective effort of love and intimacy. In six video sessions, Prayer: Finding *Intimacy with God captures the* secret to opening our hearts and minds to Scripture as the means to hear from God and then respond in conversation, basking in his presence and resolving to live in and through his love.
