## from our pastor

## pax et bonum

Dear Folks,

### Four simple things:

**One:** if you haven't already donated to the Bishop's Lenten Appeal, you should have recently received a mailing soliciting your help. I encourage all parish households to participate to whatever degree you are capable. Thank you.

**Two:** where did the angels come from on the altar? The stand is called a tabor, and often has angels holding a platform on which is placed the monstrance for adoration. It was a gift from friends, because of my promotion of Adoration. I had thought of using it during the Easter octave, and just this week remembered to bring it out.

I don't intend for it to be a permanent addition, but perhaps a periodic one during times of added solemnity.

Three: Photo Contest... oops... Maybe the beginning of Lent wasn't the best time for this. Also, I have been delayed because of the number of physical pictures submitted (I had hoped they would all come by email, as digital much easier for me). This has delayed me figuring out how to judge them all

on even footing. This will be coming soon.

Four: I recently came across a post on facebook about a little prayer to say while lighting candles, "Jesus is the Light of the world, a Light which never knows darkness." It struck me as a lovely little prayer that taps into a great spiritual practice. It is extraordinary useful to tap into everyday activities to trigger a simple act of faith and devotion. I think this is one of the reasons that Jesus used so many parables from daily living, so that daily life would lead them to recollect his love.

Another classic one is whenever you drive by a Catholic Church, to make the sign of the cross (and some add "Blessed be Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar.") Anyway, this all led me to wonder, what sort of devotional habits do you have? I have a special prayer in spanish that I say when I pull out of my driveway, which itself is a longer story for another bulletin note. 




We invite all Christians to gather in the peace of Christ at St. Mary Monday, May 14 as we "prepare a place for unity and peace" together.
