

from our pastor

pax et bonum

Dear Folks,

With first communions wrapping up this weekend, it reminds me of how I am often questioned about the fast before receiving communion. Canon law states, "One who is to receive the most Holy Eucharist is to abstain from any food or drink, with the exception only of water and medicine, for at least the period of one hour before Holy Communion" (CIC 919 §1). Elderly people, those who are ill, and their caretakers are excused from the Eucharistic fast (CIC 191 §3). Now some specifications:

- 1. The hour is counted from the time of receiving holy communion, not from the beginning of Mass. So yes, a long homily, can help here! On Sundays communion almost never less than 30 minutes after Mass starts. Mostly this just means you can't eat on your way to Mass.
- 2. Coffee and Chewing gum DO BREAK the fast. Water does not. So no Starbucks pit stop on your way to Mass.
- 3. Medicine never breaks the fast. If the medicine requires that it be taken with food, then this food does not break the fast.
- 4. Sometimes I visit folks in Hospitals, and they don't know when I will arrive. If I arrive just after a meal, notice that the fast does not apply to the "ill and their caretakers."
- 4. The parish priests can, in individual cases, wave the fast for you. So if you accidentally eat something, you could ask me and I could waive the required fast for you.

This last point leads to a story where I once had a high schooler who knew that I could waive the fast. One day he came to me asking to have it waived. Because I knew him well, and that he is a bit of a WiseGuy, I decided to investigate and he conversation went thus:

Fr: "Why do you need the fast waived?"

Wiseguy: "Because I ate a donut."

Fr: "When?"

WG: "Just now in the parking lot."

Fr: "how could you possibly forget?"

WG: "I didn't, I just figured I'd get an exemption."

Fr: "You bought your ticket. You got your donut, and now you don't get Jesus."

All of this fast is about being sure to increase our spiritual hunger for Jesus, by controlling our physical hunger. The one builds off of the other and prepares us to more worthily recieve Our Lord.

Grow for Your Neighbor (GFYN) is a program that provides fresh produce to the Fredericksburg Regional Food Bank. It provides opportunities for families to experience the joys of gardening, to experience the intrinsic value of giving back to their community, and to foster an appreciation of nature and the value of healthy eating.

Saint Mary will once again support Grow for Your Neighbor's summer program during the June to October growing season and is looking for volunteers.

Last year, Saint Mary volunteers collected in excess of 7,000 lbs or 5,800 meals of fresh produce. This year, volunteer opportunities include receiving donations at the Fredericksburg Food Bank Tent at the Spotsylvania Farmer's Market on Route 3 West (commuter lot) and the pick-up and delivery of donations to the food bank. Collection days and times are Saturdays 8am–noon. Pick-up is at noon and drop off to the Food Bank must be made by 1pm. We are looking to organize small teams of 2-3 persons, once a month for a 2-4 hour commitment—it's a perfect service opportunity for Scouts, youth groups and Outreach Ministries. Concerts at St. Mary will present organist Ken Cowan in a concert which will explore the many tonal resources of St. Mary's 49-rank Robert William Wallace pipe organ.

Regarded as one of North America's finest concert organists and praised for his dazzling artistry, impeccable technique, and imaginative programming by audiences and critics alike, Ken Cowan maintains a rigorous performing schedule that takes him to major concert venues in America, Canada, Europe and Asia. Recent feature performances have included appearances at Verizon Hall in Philadelphia with the Philadelphia Orchestra, Maison Symphonique in Montreal, Walt Disney Concert Hall in Los Angeles as well as concerts in Germany and Korea. In recent vears, Mr. Cowan has been featured artist at conventions held by the American Guild of Organists, the Organ Historical Society and the Royal Canadian College of Organists. Mr.

Cowan has recorded numerous compact disc recordings which have earned critical acclaim for labels such as Pro Organo, JAV and Raven. A native of Thorold, Ontario, Canada, Mr. Cowan holds degrees from the Yale Institute of Sacred Music where he studied with Thomas Murray and the Curtis Institute of Music studying with John Weaver. In

2012, Mr. Cowan joined the key-board faculty of the Shepherd School of Music at Rice University, Houston, Texas as Associate Professor and head of the organ department. In addition, he is Organist and Artist-in-Residence at Palmer Episcopal Church in Houston.

The concert program which will

be presented by Mr. Cowan will include performances of Mendelssohn's Sonata in F Minor, Wagner's Wotan's Farewell and Magic Fire Music, Dupré's Second Organ Symphony and Mephisto Waltz No. 1 by Franz Liszt. Admission to the concert is free and a free-will offering will be taken to support future Concerts at St. Mary productions. Following the concert there will be a reception in the church's Parish Life Center where there will be an opportunity to meet Ken Cowan and share fellowship with others.




We invite all Christians to gather in the peace of Christ at St. Mary Monday, May 21 as we "prepare a place for unity and peace" together.
