

Caregivers: A Tip You May Not Have Considered

Most of us, at some time find ourselves in the role of caregiver and most of the time it's a time of joy and gratitude, albeit exhausting. Kids, family responsibilities, the whole thing can take a toll. Other times are even more of a challenge with sleepless nights, anxious moments and fear that you may fail.

Resources abound to support you, no matter where you may be in this journey. But sometimes these "resources" turn out to be just another item to add to the to-do list.

Here is a tip that not only can provide much needed rest and refocus, but barely interrupts a busy schedule. A J-O-Y Meditation.

First, consider your day and pick a 10 minute period of time you can sit without interruption. You may also want to establish a place that you set aside for this purpose. Sit, quieting your mind and heart.

Next, recall a scene in the life of Jesus "J" – it can be anything – and think on that scene for a minute or two. Recalling His passion in the garden, or walking by the sea will do for starters. Or choose Christ's words like "I am the way" to repeat in your mind during your meditation. Over time, you will find yourself returning to themes or patterns.

Next, consider the "O", others in your life who may need lifting up. Simply call their name to mind and offer a simple blessing. "The Lord bless you and keep you" is one example.

Finally: Offer yourself, "Y"- asking God to walk with you through the coming day. "Oh my Jesus, I trust in You" is a powerful way to acknowledge Christ by your side.

Finally, offer a simple closing prayer "Our Lady of the Way, Pray for us,"

Establishing this simple, sacred time and space in your busy day will open new ways to cope with the day's challenges.

Grade 3-6 Religious Education Classes

In the spring of 2017 about 190 Religious Education students received their First Communion but only about 70 of them returned to Religious Education classes in fall. Most of them, if they return, will return for Confirmation classes. Last school year students in Grades 3, 4, 5 and 6 were only 32% of our students. Students preparing for sacraments were 68%. "Sacraments Only" Religious Education has become too popular. There are several reasons for this including working parents, busy weekends, sports and a changing relationship with God and our church.

Please encourage your Catholic family members, relatives, friends and neighbors to practice their faith and register their children for Religious Education every year. Our registration fee in June and July is the cheapest.

fr. folmar

Hello!

My name is Father Michael Folmar and I was recently ordained for our Diocese this past June 9th, the memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, a very significant day for me. For, it was Our Lady and her Immaculate Heart that have guided me throughout my life and, praise God, brought me here to a parish named after Our Lady and her Immaculate Conception. I was born in Pittsburgh (Go Steelers! – you know yinz like them!), where both sides of my family are from, and have lived in various places due to my dad's job, but have mainly lived in our amazing Diocese in Northern VA. I received a B.S. in Biology at George Mason University while working at Red Hot and Blue next door to it. Shortly after, I became a Franciscan Missionary of the Eternal Word down at EWTN in AL for about six years where tremendous spiritual foundations were laid. Although I was happy as a brother, I realized that as a priest I would not be as happy. For, religious orders specialize in certain areas - down at EWTN it was the media and taking care of the sisters and pilgrims to EWTN. There always was a flame inside of me for our Diocese, even when I went off to be a Franciscan. The time I spent with the order wasn't a waste of time though because it really prepared me for what I'm doing

now and will do in the future. Moreover, I can't thank the Franciscans enough for all the ways that God formed me there, which was in ways that I never would have been formed if I had not gone there first. Finally, I went to Mount Saint Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg, MD, which now brings me to here. A beautiful parish dedicated to my two loves, Our Eucharistic King and Our Lady, as it is filled with wonderful and caring parishioners! Praise God! May Our Lady always protect you with her mantle of protection!

Former Army Captain William Haneke, a wounded Vietnam Veteran, and some colleagues recognized the need to assist family members who were away from home tending to their loved ones when they saw two young mothers with babies arrive from across the country with no money and barely enough gas to make the trip. The organization gives 100 percent of all tax-deductible donations to the families to help with food, lodging, transportation, child care, diapers and long-distance calling cards during the many weeks a family is in the Richmond area, and each family currently receives \$7,500.00.
