from our pastor

Dear Folks,

What would you do to save your children from slavery?

Anything.

This week I was away at a Scripture conference retreat, and one of the themes was Mercy. Our notion of mercy is often just too thin: "Lord, don't give me what I deserve. You are a nice guy, be nice to me, please." It is not just God saying, "that's ok, I don't mind."

In the scriptures, mercy is much, much more. Mercy is covenant faithfulness. A covenant is a blood oath bonding persons in a family relationship. By the blood and water of the cross washing us in baptism, we are made brothers and sisters of the Lord, and sons and daughters of the Father. The oath that the Father has promised us is to rescue us from slavery. If we are taken in slavery, he promises to seek us out, and pay the price of our ransom to the slaveholder to set us free. This is what a redeemer does.

So when we ask for mercy, we are confessing our enslavement to sin, and asking God to remember the promise He made to set us free! We are asking Him to redeem us by His eternal enduring faithful love because we are His blood brothers and sisters. Every invocation of mercy, is a proclamation of suffering, death, and resurrection of Our Lord and a making present of that mystery.

By remembering the price paid, we can value and treasure the gift of Mercy.

What does the Lord do to save His children from slavery?

You know the answer. Live accordingly.

Health Ministry

MEN! Take Care

We often hear about men leading the way in a variety of ways. But there is one area men would do well to catch up with the ladies: Healthy Living. Women lead the way in taking care of their health. Perhaps that is because they may be more conscious about how they look, or because they may be seeing their doctor more frequently during their childbearing years. Whatever the reason, men need to step up! In every state, statistics from the Kaiser Family Foundation tell us that more men are overweight or obese than woman and we all know the cascade of health related problems that comes with those pounds. Additionally, according to the CDC, unintended injuries such as those from accidental fires, car crashes and falls account for the third leading cause of death among men following heart disease and cancer. Women rank sixth in that category.

Volumes have been written on the healthy steps to take, but let's keep it simple for now. Consider the following list and pick 4 steps you believe you can reasonably follow for the next month. Keep track of your "score" and adapt your plan as needed to insure improvement.

1. Check in with your doctor. Don't skip that annual physical. Let him/her know your healthy living plan.

2. Limit red meat.

3. Limit white bread and white rice. Stick with high fiber products.

4. Make water your number one drink. Check with your doctor for any restrictions that may apply for you.

5. Read up on the DASH or American Plate diets. Both are available on line.

6. Exercise 30 mins five or more times a week; walking is a good start.

7. Make prayer a part of your "healthy" routine. God knows your struggles.

8. Sleep at least seven hours a day.

9. Drink alcohol in moderation.

10. Hang with people who lift you up. Stay away from whiners and complainers.



health corner beat the heat

Right now school is out, summer is finally here and a day spent in the garden, at the beach or playing outdoor sports all day sounds ideal. The temptation to spend excessive amounts of time outside in the hot sun and high temperatures is inviting. However this can easily lead to dehydration and heat stroke, which you definitely need to avoid.

And why is that? This is because approximately 75% of your body weight is water. Your brain and heart are 73% water, your lungs are approximately 83% water, your muscles and kidneys are 79% water and even your bones contain 31% water. Why do we need water? Water is a vital nutrient of every living cell in our bodies and we have 37.2 trillion cells in your body. We need water: To help regulate your internal body temperature, when you breathe and perspire To transport all the nutrients that you eat through your bloodstream To act as a shock absorber for your brain, spinal cord and unborn child. To form saliva to help you to start digesting your food To lubricate your joints so that you can walk

How much water should we drink to keep our body cells happy? Everyone is unique, but a good rule of thumb is to consume half your body weight in ounces of water per day e.g. 140 lbs/2 = 70 ounces

We lose water every day in for form of water vapor when we breathe out and in the form of water when we sweat. Along with water, small amounts of salts or electrolytes (calcium, magnesium, and potassium) are lost. Our bodies are constantly readjusting the balance between water and electrolyte losses with fluid intake. We need to drink more water and electrolytes during the hot summer days, so that our bodies stay balanced and avoid symptoms of dehydration and heat stroke brinking sufficient water is important to daily health but you can also eat several fruits and vegetables that will keep you hydrated and provide you with essential electrolytes during the hot weather.

Watermelon: 92% water and contains vitamins A and C, B1 and B6, one cup = 1.5 mg sodium, 1.5 mg potassium, 170 mg magnesium, 15.2 mg calcium, 10.6 mg phosphorus).

Strawberries: 91% water and contains vitamin C and folate. 1 cup = 1.5mg sodium, 233mg potas-

sium, 19.8mg Magnesium, 24.3 gm calcium, 36.5 mg phosphorus **Celery:** 96% water; contains vitamins A, C, K and folate, iron and zinc; one stalk contains sodium 32 mg, potassium, 4 mg, magnesium, 216 mg calcium, 10 mg phosphorus.

mg, potassium, 4 mg, magnesium, 210 mg m **Cucumber:** 96% water; one medium cucumber contains vitamin K, 4 mg sodium, 273 mg potassium, 24.1 mg magnesium, 28.1 mg calcium, 42.2 mg phosphorus along with a healthy dose of vitamin K.

Coconut water: One cup contains, 252 mg sodium, 600 mg potassium, 60 mg magnesium, 48 mg phosphorus, 0.24 mg zinc. Coconut water is an excellent source of rehydration, since the electrolyte content closely matches that of human body fluids.

Remember to keep your body hydrated during the hot summer!

After the abortion, I never would have believed things could get better. But, amazingly, since my post-abortion counseling, I have experienced hope and healing and self-forgiveness. — A mother who lost a child in an abortion (Visit www.hopeafterabortion. com if you or someone you know has been affected by an abortion.) We pray for all those suffering from the effects of abortion, that they may be healed.
