Dear Folks,

This week I listened to a podcast that caught my ear and put a smile on my face. It was Jeff Cavins, a Scripture Scholar who often leads pilgrimages to the Holy Land. The podcast was called "Scoot down the pew please?" In short, it led me to preach a daily Mass homily on sitting in the pew.

We all love our seats. Creatures of Habit, lovers of ritual, comfort in stability. Lots of good reasons. Folks arrive early to get the end seats on pews. And woe to the usher who has to say, "Scoot down the pew please." As Jeff tells the story, he builds up the very human moment of eye contact and frustration and annoyance that can come with such a simple request.







#### What is a Life Chain?

The first Life Chain, born through prayer, was built in 1987 by Please Let Me Live, a small pro-life ministry in Yuba City, California. From its small beginning, the Life Chain has grown to over 1,800 Life Chains in the United States and Canada, and is a call to the Christian Church to mobilize against an abortion holocaust that claims over one million American lives annually, and has claimed over sixty million lives worldwide, through surgical abortion. The Life Chain is a peaceful, prayerful, silent demonstration.

Hundreds of Christians - clergy and lay people -- stand 25 to 50 feet apart to form a prayer chain and hold signs reading Abortion Kills Children, Jesus Forgives and Heals, Adoption: The Loving Option, Lord, Forgive Us and Our Nation, Life: The First Inalienable Right. This powerful, visual impact not only raises community awareness but has also been credited with saving children's lives. Consider the words of Pope John Paul II who said, "When life before birth is attacked, we will stand up. No one ever has the authority to destroy unborn human life."

St. Mary Parish will again participate in the Annual Life Chain on Sunday, October 7 and welcomes all our parishioners and local churches as well. We will meet in the Parish Life Center at 2pm to pick up our signs and walk up to Route 1, where we will form a chain along Route 1 from Route 3 to College Avenue until 3:30pm. All Catholic students in public, private and parochial schools grades 8-12, are invited to participate in the 2018 Knights of Columbus Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest. This years theme is "How does your family keep its Catholic Faith in Action?"
