
STEM: Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics

Our students are learning so much and having a wonderful time doing it. Our 8th graders are off to a fast start in physical science as they built rubber band racers to explore the different forms of energy that can be used to make a vehicle move. This activity also helped with understanding the Scientific Method, as the racers had to stop at a designated area. It is amazing how much fun we can have in physical science.

Our second graders faced a serious challenge when they were given two plates, Skittles, and a straw, and had to figure out how to get the Skittles from one plate to the next, without touching the plates or Skittles. Their teacher used a stopwatch to record times. They were given 5 timed attempts. Most started off by using the straw as a vacuum. They could not use the same technique twice so they then experimented by making the straw into chopsticks, knots, and slings. We could not believe how fast they got at figuring it out.

They also learned expanded form this week in math. The children 'expanded' balloons and then had to write a standard form and expanded form number on it. That is a lesson they will not soon forget!



What is a Life Chain?

The first Life Chain, born through prayer, was built in 1987 by Please Let Me Live, a small pro-life ministry in Yuba City, California. From its small beginning, the Life Chain has grown to over 1,800 Life Chains in the United States and Canada, and is a call to the Christian Church to mobilize against an abortion holocaust that claims over one million American lives annually, and has claimed over sixty million lives worldwide, through surgical abortion. The Life Chain is a peaceful, prayerful, silent demonstration.

Hundreds of Christians - clergy and lay people -- stand 25 to 50 feet apart to form a prayer chain and hold signs reading Abortion Kills Children, Jesus Forgives and Heals, Adoption: The Loving Option, Lord, Forgive Us and Our Nation, Life: The First Inalienable Right. This powerful, visual impact not only raises community awareness but has also been credited with saving children's lives.
