

Dear Folks,

Things swirling through my mind this morning as I type, the furlough, the Super Bowl, and the Teachers. First the Furlough. With the furlough, there are many people is this area who are facing tougher times than normal, many of whom are our brothers and sisters in this parish. Please pay attention to your friends and neighbors. And for those most directly affected by this furlough, please come and use our parish food bank if needed. We have very active and engaged outreach ministries, and we don't want to forget our own.

The store gladly accepts donated items of clothing and household supplies and will even come to your home to pick up donated furniture that's in good shape. Volunteers with pick-up trucks or large vehicles are also very much needed. All of the sales at the Thrift Store go directly to help those in need in our community.

Every Thursday at 6pm St. Vincent de Paul offers interviews/ appointments for those needing emergency financial assistance. These meetings are held at Eastland United Methodist Church 10718 Courthouse Road, Fredericksburg. With funding limited, the first 30 people in line are assisted each week.
