Dear Folks,

Today we celebrate the Super Bowl. Best of luck to folks who care about either team. And best wishes to all who will celebrate with family and friends. It is interesting how it has become a sort of National Holiday. I read a few years ago that more guacamole is consumed today than any other day all year.

On a much more sobering note: I know that we have all been disturbed by the news from New York and the actions of one of our Catholic brothers who worked for and celebrated the passing of a new barbaric law which in some cases allows the murder of children up to the moment of their birth. Pray and Fast. Our Lord says that some demons can only be cast out by prayer and fasting. And be engaged in the political life of our country.


