# The Passion on Palm Sunday and Good Friday

As we did last year, on Palm Sunday and Good Friday, the words of the crowd during the proclamation of the Passion will be spoken by one of our parish lectors, rather than by the entire assembly. In the Breaking Bread hymnal, parts are broken out for Christ, Narrator, Voice, and Crowd. This is done by the publisher of Breaking Bread and other missalette companies, but it's not official.

The main reason for not having the assembly say the words of the Jewish crowds is that it tends to make the Passion seem like a reenactment. In our liturgies, we remember the events of salvation, such as Jesus' entry in Jerusalem or the Last Supper, but do not reenact them. Instead, when we recall and celebrate these events together as worshipping Church, the spiritual reality of these happenings long ago in time is made present to us now.

Another consideration: if the whole assembly is saying the words of the crowd, it tends to reinforce the idea that the whole of the Jewish people called for Jesus' death, an erroneous thought we must not seem foster in any way. In fact, requiring people to say the words of the crowd is painful for many, and since it is neither required nor part of the tradition, it is fair in our liturgical worship to not make people opt out of something that isn't an official practice in the first place.

The Passion Gospel, like any other scripture passage, is a proclamation of God's Word. The active receiving of this proclaimed Word by the assembly and its being put into action by their lives today are what is happening. While the words of the crowds are part of the story, let us focus on the central theme of the Passion, Christ's complete and unconditional love offered for us, and the invitation through our baptism to offer ourselves in that love and bring it to the world for its salvation.

Dear Folks,

Palm Sunday begins the great celebrations of our faith. Let his merciful enduring love be the lens through which you see everything celebrated this week. Jesus loves you so much that he did all this so that you might know His mercy.

Consider Adam's reaction to the original sin, and how it is reflected in our own reactions. When God comes looking for us like Adam, we can either resent or repent. Do we blame the Lord, or accept his mercy. I made an observation that when the movie "The Passion of the Christ" came out folks reacted with either: "look what they say I did to Him" (resent) or "look what I did to him" (repent)! I think even a third option is better: "look what he did for me!" Keep your eyes on Him, and know that He gave his life freely for you.

And speaking of the seat of Mercy.... confessions: available at 12:30pm and 6:30pm on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of this week. Your parish priests will be serving up big helpings of mercy. Those who are really observant may note that the 12:30 pm confessions don't appear in the calendar we have been publishing all lent. Yep, they are your bonus for reading this column! Lines always get longer all week, so have mercy on your parish priests and get there Monday!







# What is the process for dealing with allegations of sexual abuse of a minor?

- All allegations are reported immediately to legal authorities.
- The Diocese cooperates fully with any law enforcement investigation.
- All allegations are forwarded to the diocesan Victim Assistance Coordinator so that outreach to the alleged victimsurvivor can be offered.
- After a prompt internal initial investigation, if the allegation meets a preliminary threshold of credibility, the accused cleric is placed on administrative leave.
- An announcement is published at parishes and any diocesan institution where the accused cleric served.
- When the diocesan review is complete, all evidence is considered by the Diocesan Review Board, which consists mostly of lay men and women.
- The Review Board determines whether the allegation is credible and advises the Bishop regarding the accused cleric's suitability for ministry. (No cleric with a credible allegation of sexual abuse against a minor may return to ministry.)
- If an act of child abuse by the accused cleric is admitted or established, the Bishop will take appropriate canonical action, up to and including laicization.
