Dear Folks,

Today is Mother's Day! Happy Mother's Day to all mothers: biological, adoptive, spiritual, godmothers. I assure you of my prayers and blessing. I offer this lovely quote from Joseph Cardinal Mindszenty:

"The most important person on earth is a mother. She cannot claim the honor of having built Notre Dame Cathedral. She need not. She has built something more magnificent than any cathedral — a dwelling for an immortal soul, the tiny perfection of her baby's body."

"The Angels have not been blessed with a such a grace. They cannot share in God's Creative miracle to bring new Saints to Heaven. Only a human mother can. Mothers are closer to God the Creator than any other creatures. God joins forces with mothers in performing this act of creation."

Thanks to our Catechists and their assistants. They spend spend untold hours in preparation and teaching each week in order to pass on the Catholic faith to a new generation of believers.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our diocesan priests dedicate their lives to serve and guide the faithful on our life-long journey of faith. They have administered the sacraments, preached the Gospel, encouraged and prayed for us and our families. When their full-time service ends, they need a suitable place to live in retirement.

Currently there are 184 diocesan priests faithfully serving Jesus Christ and you, the people who form our diocesan Church. Of these, 22 priests are retired; and over the next ten years 23 additional priests will reach retirement age.

Next weekend, May 18 and 19, at all Masses, the annual second collection for retired priests will take place in parishes in our diocese.

The funds from this annual collection assist several special needs including the ongoing operational expenses of the Saint Rose of Lima Priests Retirement Villa, a residence that includes common areas and private suites for up to 15 priests. This special collection also will provide funds for clergy post-retirement health care, nursing home care and the priests' pension fund.

I ask you to be as generous as possible, so that our priests, who have faithfully served the People of God in our diocese may be cared for in their retirement years.

May Our Risen Lord Jesus bless you with the gift of His peace and watch over you always.


We invite all Christians to gather in the peace of Christ at St. Mary Monday, May 13 as we "prepare a place for unity and peace" together.
