Fees are due at time of registration unless other arrangements are made through the Religious Education Office. We do not accept debit or credit cards.

The registration fee for home-taught children is the same as for children who attend class.

There is a \$20 fee for Year I Confirmation candidates.

There is a \$50 fee for Year II Confirmation candidates. It covers the retreat, facilitator fee, food and Confirmation robe.

There is a \$20 fee for Year II First Reconciliation, First Communion students.

Refunds will be granted on a case-by-case basis.



Helpful Hints & Reminders

- Did you know that when you write a check, you should use only black or blue ink? All other colors may look very nice, but they don't show up on bank scanners and bank employees have to manually enter the amount at the bottom of the check or return the check to us. So please use only black or blue ink when writing a check.
