I have encountered no pain greater than a parent losing a child.

In today's bulletin, we have a moving note "from the pews" of one such parent. It begins on this page, and is a moving witness to grace in the midst of unspeakable pain.

For that grief, I would like to announce a candlelight Mass on the day of the March for Life, January 24th. Many parents who have lost children during pregnancy have been told they aren't allowed to grieve. I suppose that grief is a slap in the face of our culture's blind and obstinate denial of the gift of life in the womb.

So if you lost a child, in pregnancy, in school, in college, or adulthood this Mass will be offered both for your child(ren) and for you. All are invited to come and offer a prayer of support.

### From the Pews at St. Mary

I am proof of God's love and support. I can assure you, He is there when you need Him, and only He can see you through the darkest of times. I should know...I'm a grieving father.

My wife and I lost our son, Christopher, on November 1, 2015, from head injuries due to a fall. He was a mechanical engineering senior at VCU. It was a Sunday – for me, it's "The Day the Hammer Fell." Two Spotsy sheriff deputies came to our home to deliver the news. When they left, my wife and I held each other and she said, "Whatever happens we have to do this together." She was in shock, as was I, yet I flew into a rage. I have no idea how I didn't destroy the dining room, or break both my hands. I ran into his room, grabbed his pillow and began to cry. A cry many people don't know, a cry from the pit of despair, which I wish no parent, would ever know.

Neither of us knew what to say. We were in trouble and needed help. I wanted to die, and I was serious – I've never known that type of grief before, but I couldn't leave my wife alone. I never knew a night could be so dark or so long. We called St. Mary and spoke with Fr. Holmes (former parochial vicar) he was very compassionate, his voice through the phone literally saved me...saved us. He knew what to say, and how to say it, and for that I'm eternally grateful. We still communicate with him today.

Thus began a long, slow, ongoing process of renewal, introspection and forgiveness. I had to forgive Chris for leaving us and I had to forgive God for taking him. I had to accept there was nothing I could have done to prevent it, and I had to stop blaming myself. We still don't know exactly what happened, or why and the bottom line is, even if we did, it wouldn't change the outcome. So what do I do? Keep seeking answers? I did, but eventually learned that is a trap. You put on the mileage and expend effort, but you do it in a circle, so you don't actually go anywhere. For me, I had to re-tool. I had to do a hard boot of my entire being. I had to start over, but how does one do that?

I decided to go to confession. When I was done, I felt different. I was different. It was a start. I

### **Family Week January 2020**







became open to signs that were being sent and finally believed in them, that our Chrisser was okay. I know I'll see him again. I also started noticing people – not just looking at them, but really seeing them, in a way I hadn't before. I notice the sky just before sunrise. I see the unqualified love in our dog's eyes, and in our new grandson, Liam Christopher.

Chris' friends are moving on, but none forget, and we still communicate with almost all of them, which is comforting to us. I still go backwards sometimes, thinking of what should have been, might have been, what we had planned. Everything now – everything – is before or after November 1. But I remember being in a shop a year or so after, and saw a poem entitled, "Footprints in the Sand." It describes Jesus' love for us. He walks beside us, two sets of footprints. Yet on the saddest days of life, only one set is visible. When asked why the Lord would leave when we need Him the most, He replies, "My precious child, I love you and will never leave you. During your times of trail and testing, when you see only one set of footprints, it was then that I carried you."

I realized how I got through those first awful months – with the help of God, our family, friends, counseling and just being there for each other. We have also been able to talk to and help others who have lost children. As stated in 2 Corinthians: "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God." I'm still here, and happy. I hope my story helps those who may need it. God bless you.

### First Offering Contributions

### To Help Offset Cost of Collection Envelopes

Each year in January the envelope packet always includes an envelope marked "First Offering" with a suggested donation of \$15. This is not a regular collection, but merely a request for a free-will offering to help offset the cost of the printing and bimonthly mailing of collection envelopes to more than 5,000 parish families. From July 2018 to June 2019, the parish's cost for the offering envelopes was \$17,652.85. First Offering donations received for the same period totaled \$7,111. Your generosity and support in helping to offset the cost of the envelopes is greatly appreciated.
