

### from our pastor

## pax et bonum

Dear Folks,

Is your car a mess? Or your office? Or your Inbox? My car is actually pretty clean inside, while the outside is a little salty this winter. But I know lots of folks struggle with keeping a car interior clean, especially if they have children! I remember years ago my nephew being very concerned because he got chocolate all over the seats in my car. I laughed and said, "That is the price of being an uncle, sometimes the chocolate is all over."

But my office? That is another story! Yikes, stacks of paper, all representing work or marriage prep or annulments or meeting requests or sales pitches and on and on.

And email inboxes? How many people just give up on trying to empty them out? My dad recently asked for help clearing out the 27,000 emails out of his inbox. We just made him a new gmail.com account instead.

Ok... but what possible 'Jesus connection' am I thinking? When you clean out your car/office/inbox, you suddenly become much more aware of previously unnoticed threats to re-cluttering your life. A candy wrapper in the car, an unreturned message on the desk, or email spam coming in. The same thing can happen with our souls, especially if we haven't been to confession in ages. It is such an amazing experience as a priest, to help people to clear out their souls of the debris and clutter of sin. Truly, as a priest, I rank it a privilege second only to transubstantiating bread and wine into Jesus.

Once we clear out the debris that was intimidating us from returning to Jesus, we become much more sensitive to maintaining the spiritual health and cleanliness of our souls. I often tell folks who return from many years away from the sacrament, "Don't be surprised if you start to remember and recall smaller sins. Just bring them confidently to your next confession. Jesus will always welcome you home."

#### First Penance

On February 21 and 27 children preparing for First Holy Communion, this spring will make their First Confession. Below is an excerpt from the Diocese second grade standards for learning.

#### **Moral Life**

Suggested Reading: God gave the Ten Commandments to Moses (Exodus 20:1-21).

Sin is when we choose to break God's laws (e.g., The Ten Commandments); sin is an offense against God

- We can sin by our thoughts, words, deeds, and omissions (what we fail to do)
- God hates sin, but is patient with sinners. We too should hate sin and be patient with sinners
- There are two kinds of sin: mortal sin and venial sin
- Mortal Sin kills the life of grace in the soul
  - Mortal sin requires three conditions:
    - 1) It is grave (ask: is it serious?)
    - 2) It is committed with knowledge (Ask: did we know it is wrong?)
    - 3) It is committed with free will (ask: did we freely choose to do it?)
- Venial Sin weakens the life of grace in the soul but does not remove it.
  - Venial sin is less serious.
- Serious sin that lacks full knowledge or free consent lessens culpability
- An accident is not a sin, even when its effects are serious.

### Helpful Hints & Reminders

- Did you know that when you write a check, you should use only black or blue ink? All other colors may look very nice, but they don't show up on bank scanners and will not be accepted by the bank. So please use only black or blue ink when writing a check.
- When you receive your 2019 contribution statement, you may notice that one or more of the collections may show only a penny as your contribution. That's because when the envelope was received for posting in our database, no amount was written on the envelope, so a penny was entered to show that an envelope was received but the amount was unknown. Don't forget to write the amount of your contribution on the outside of your contribution envelope.
- From time to time we receive contributions in envelopes from other parishes in the Diocese. If there is no notation, it is our policy to send these contributions to the parish indicated on the envelope. If your contribution is actually meant for St. Mary, please be sure to use St. Mary envelopes, or a plain envelope with your name and address indicated, or cross out the name of the parish on the envelope and clearly write St. Mary on the envelope so that we can process your contribution properly.
- Our parish supports the Society of St. Vincent de Paul in their outstanding ministry to those in need, through all Poor Box Donations. If you wish to make a poor box donation by check, please be sure to make the check payable to St. Mary Catholic Church. If you make your check payable to St. Vincent de Paul, the check should be mailed directly to them at PO Box 1493 College Station, Fredericksburg VA 22402.

#### **Catholic Cemetery**

It is now possible to purchase burial plots in a special Catholic section of a cemetery located in King George County, just 30 minutes from downtown. This is being made possible by St. Elizabeth in Colonial Beach & St. Anthony in King George, in cooperation with the Historyland Memorial Park located 11227 James Madison Parkway. Development will unfold over time as the grave plots are purchased. We hope that you will be helped by this effort and opportunity.

Some key features:

- •All the graves will be facing east, which is traditionally Christian, "Facing the Coming of the Lord" as we await resurrection of our bodies on that Last Day.
- •After entering the elegant wrought iron gateway, the main gravel walkway will terminate in an exedra wherein will stand a tall and stately Crucifix.
- •Beyond the end of the cemetery is a vast stretch of woods which will provide a natural a beautiful backdrop to our resting place, especially in the Autumn of the year.
- •We are also considering the placement of an outdoor altar, benches, and a possible hedge or brick wall.

Plots are currently priced at \$2,100, discounts may apply depending on time of purchase.
