Dear Folks,
Today I got an email from someone, about a difficult neighbor. It triggered a memory from my childhood.
See, we lived in a court. This was heaven. We had a huge back yard (by suburban standards for neighborhoods built in late '60s). But that court! It was our basketball court (with trash cans), our street hockey rink, our wiffle ball diamond, and kick the can empire!

But other people lived in our neighborhood. And one of them often called the cops on us. It was a regular thing that any game in the court involved seeing if neighbors were home and guessing the likelihood of the cops showing up because we wanted to play catch or we might make too much noise while playing a game. Many days mom would say, 'play in the back yard today.' Other times a ball would go into their yard, and we knew the game was over until we could mount an operation under cover of darkness to sneak into the yard and retrieve it. No fence, no security, just the certainty that if we were seen stepping on their grass the cops would be called.
I don't recall my parents every saying an unkind word about this neighbor. Or the others that would walk their dog always stopping in our front yard, and you know what I mean. You see, we stood out: eight children and Catholic, and with parents not afraid to invite others to know and love the Lord.

After all of us were adults and grown, this neighbor knocked on the door one day to ask my mother for forgiveness. Personal pain and loss had hardened hearts against the Lord, and the closest target was the noticeably Catholic family neighbor. Tears were shed, and my mom was overjoyed to embrace in forgiveness.
I like to think that this neighbor and my mom are hugging right now in heaven.

I asked them both to pray for difficult neighbors. We all might have one. I thank my mom and dad for teaching us to "Live by the Sprit, Walk by the Spirit." The Holy Spirit, through kindness, really does melt hearts.

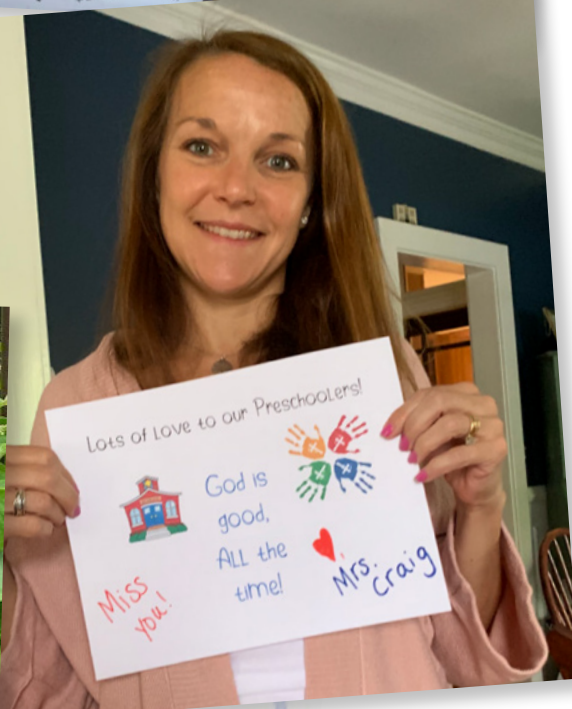
We Miss Our Students!!

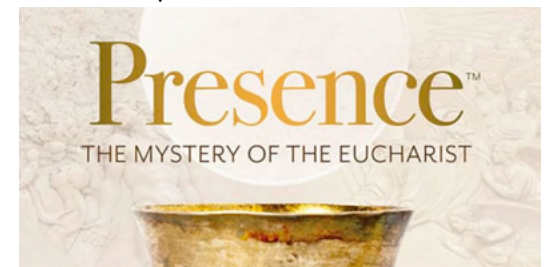

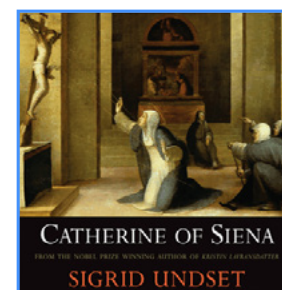


Students Preparing for Confirmation Video of the Week:

mass readings

Reading 1 ACTS 2:14A, 36-41

Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice, and proclaimed: "Let the whole house of Israel know for certain that God has made both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified."

Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart, and they asked Peter and the other apostles, "What are we to do, my brothers?" Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is made to you and to your children and to all those far off, whomever the Lord our God will call." He testified with many other arguments, and was exhorting them, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand persons were added that day.

Gospel JN 10:1-10

Jesus said: "Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever does not enter a sheepfold through the gate but climbs over elsewhere is a thief and a robber. But whoever enters through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens it for him, and the sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice. But they will not follow a stranger; they will run away from him, because they do not recognize the voice of strangers." Although Jesus used this figure of speech, the Pharisees did not realize what he was trying to tell them.

So Jesus said again, "Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy; I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly."

Homily for the 4th Sunday of Easter 2020

The Lord begins the good shepherd discourse not showing his hand. He waits until it sinks in that his listeners don't understand what He is saying. Finally, He reveals the meaning of story. Jesus of Nazareth alone can lead you to through the gate. Not only is He the shepherd, He is the gate as well. Everyone else is a danger to the sheep. This is pretty exclusive. Our Lord makes room for no one else. There isn't another teacher or way. There is no co-shepherd or similar gate. "This is the way." Yep, I stole that from the Mandalorian. But in truth, the Mandalorian stole it from us.

The ancient Church used "The Way" to describe themselves. It described themselves perfectly. Jesus is the way and gave us a way. Those of us who follow along the way with Him are on a journey to a true homeland. Modern folks bristle at this. "Are you saying you all are the only people that have the truth?" Every Christian before us would have simply answered "Yes!" Today, modern Catholics point out that other faiths or philosophies have elements of truth to them, but that the fullness of the truth lies in Jesus' teaching alone. We do this as a form of conciliation and because it makes us feel that we aren't proud. Pride is after all the main objection of the modern world. They think we are arrogant and preachy and so write us off. They say, "There isn't any one way to God or truth." Once they've said it, most Christians simply crumble. But what they've said is nonsense.

Moderns have imagined that at the top of a mountain is the truth and any way up the mountain will get you there. But this isn't what mountain climbers actually do is it? Mountaineers find routes up the mountain, but they know for certain that there are some ways up the mountain that have a chance and others that

will always fail. What might be better is if someone could stand on top of the mountain, someone who has been there, climbed the route and shout down commands. Wouldn't that make it easy? What the modern person claims is really there is no one already at the top of the mountain. What they don't get is that Jesus is already there and He has been shouting at the top of his lungs telling us which way to go. They just don't recognize his voice.

The gate is a more apt description then the mountain in fact. This is the way. The only way. He will lead us through and He will open for us. But the modern citizen of the world won't hear his voice. He runs the length of the fence away from the Shepherd and cries foul when a robber takes him. The great problem today is that most of the sheep who know the Shepherd and his voice never cry out to the sheep going astray. They never bleat out "Trust the Shepherd! He's the only one who knows the way! Save yourself! Listen to the Shepherd!"

May be that comes down to whether or not we trust the Shepherd. May be if we were more convicted, we would bleat out that message to everyone. So why should we trust Jesus? Peter gives us the answer in the second reading. Has anyone been like Christ? No. Sure, there are others who taught. Less still who have suffered for their brothers and sisters. But there is no one in the history of the world who did both and claimed to be the Son of God. No one who has treated his oppressors with kindness and did not break. No one who made a complete holocaust of himself to free others. No one who loved like He did. Christ is unique and so is his message. The cry of this Shepherd goes out calling all to enter by the Gate. Do you hear his voice? Will you carry his cry? You can trust Him. He is faithful and true. He has given us a Way.
