from our pastor pax et bonum

Dear Folks,

Happy and Blessed Father's Day to you.

I want to exhort fathers to give something they have, their blessing.

I remember studying blessings in seminary, and the teacher emphasizing that when a father blesses children, it is a 'real' blessing. I remember being surprised by this, as it was in the context of discussing the power of the priesthood to bless persons and objects.

It is simple, make the sign of the cross on their foreheads, when you tuck them in at night, when you send them to school, whenever you can.

I share with you this recollection from Pope Benedict XVI, in his book "The Spirit of the Liturgy"

I shall never forget the devotion and heartfelt care with which my father and mother made the sign of the Cross on the forehead, mouth, and breast of us children when we went away from home, especially when the parting was a long one. This blessing was like an escort that we knew would guide us on our way. It made visible the prayer of our parents, which went with us, and it gave us the assurance that this prayer was supported by the blessing of the Savior. The blessing was also a challenge to us not to go outside the sphere of this blessing. Blessing is a priestly gesture,

and so in this sign of the Cross we felt the priesthood of parents, its special dignity and power. I believe that this blessing...should come back in a much stronger way into our daily life.

Don't be stingy, children need to live secure in the blessing of their father and their Father.

The Sign of the Cross

As you have probably noticed, the Mass always begins and ends with the sign of the cross. It is a sign of Christians- a sign that was marked on your forehead on the day of your baptism. To make the sign of the cross, you first bring your right hand to your forehead, then to your chest, then to your left shoulder and finally to your right shoulder. When you make the sign of the cross you say: 'In the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit'

What did you do prior to entering seminary?

I studied geography at the University of Mary Washington and spent my summers working as a backcountry guide.

What influenced your decision to apply for seminary entrance?

After making myself vulnerable in my relationship with Him and opening myself up to His love, I then began to discern what His plan for my life could be. After the suggestion and daily priestly witness of Fr. Vacarro, I began to discern entering the seminary.

Why do you want to be a priest?

I want to be a priest because that is what I have so far discerned my vocation to be. I want to give all of myself and share Christ's love with all. If the mission of every Christian is to make disciples, what better way to do that than as mediator of that sacramental grace. By living out my vocation I will not only be best glorifying God but happiest.

What are your favorite pastimes?

I like to hike, backpack, climb, play soccer and canoe. God created us a great playground and I like to use it.

What is your favorite quote?

Who is your favorite Saint and why?

Pope Saint John Paul II because I share his love of the outdoors and love to see Christ in the beauty of the natural world. Going into the backcountry we can encounter Christ in a refreshing way, and grow in relationship with Him by living in his artwork away from the distractions and lies that help us lose our identity in Christ.

What advice would you give to a young man thinking about the seminary?

Know that first we have a universal vocation to holiness. There is absolutely nothing but yourself that is preventing you from living out prayer and heroic virtue. Then, give the seminary a visit and talk with some seminarians and Fr Jaffe. Discernment is active; while living out holiness take steps to understand what God might have in store for you.
