A limited Mass schedule will return to St Mary's Church this weekend. **Sign-ups will NOT be required**, Social distancing and **FACE MASKS ARE REQUIRED FOR ALL MASSES**.

FOR MASSES AT HOLY CROSS ACADEMY GOING FORWARD, FOR THOSE AT RISK, WE WILL BE CONTINUING TO VERY STRICTLY ENFORCE MASKS AND AT HOLY CROSS COMMUNION WILL ONLY BE OFFERED IN THE HAND, SO IF YOU WANT TO COME TO MASS BUT WANT TO BE EXTRA CAUTIOUS, PLEASE CONSIDER HOLY CROSS ACADEMY.

Born Oct. 30, 1973, in Williamsville, N.Y., Fr. Sina is the youngest of three children of Diane and Richard Sina.

He attended Williamsville South High School Williamsville, NY and earned a bachelor's degree in political philosophy in 1995 from Washington and Lee University in Lexington, VA. He earned an M.A. in Legal and Political Theory from University College London, UK in 1996, and a law degree from Washington and Lee Law School in 2000. Afterwards he practiced law in Virginia, West Virginia and Maryland, primarily focusing on commercial litigation and construction related issues.



Fr. Sina entered Mount St. Mary's Seminary, Emmitsburg, Md. in 2008 and was ordained to the priesthood June 7, 2014.

He has served at St. John the Beloved Church in McLean and St. Agnes in Arlington. We are so excited to welcome Fr. Sina to St. Mary and look forward to getting to know him!

pax et bonum

Dear Folks,

The Lent / Pandemic beard is gone. Why? Because not only are we back in church, we actually now have more masses than before the pandemic! Because there is less space due to social distancing, we have now for this phase another 8:30 am Mass over at Holy Cross Academy on Sunday morning.

Another sign of returning? Confirmations and First Holy Communions! This past Thursday we celebrated Confirmation and now moving forward we will be celebrating these sacraments this summer in a socially distanced manner. Could you please be intentional in praying for our Confirmandi and Communicants?

How can we shape our disposition to receive these sacraments fruitfully?

1. Preparation. Do we know what we are doing and are we therefore turning our minds with faith to the love of Christ being given to us? We do our best to teach our children that Holy Communion is truly Jesus. We do our best to try to lead our young men and women to 'live and walk by the spirit.' But I promise you that everyone of us (me too) can improve here.

2. Desire. This is so key. Jesus never forces His love on us. He only offers. The spiritual life and God's love is freely given by Him and a work of His grace; yet it requires our effort. He has given us freedom that means we must cooperate with His work. The Holy Spirit is freely given to those who will receive Him.

I recall the excitement of my First Communion and the cautious hope for Confirmation. As long as I can remember, I would see my siblings and parents go forward for Holy Communion and I would desperately want to accompany them. The wisdom of the Church waits for this desire to be enkindled in the souls of her children. Can you remember and rekindle that desire now?

3. Repentance. Are we continually turning from sin? If we refuse to repent of sin, then we are saying to the Lord that we love created goods or persons more than Him and we are lessening the space in our hearts that He can fill. The solution to our lukewarmness is simply to repent with sincerity.

One of my favorite comments from a young girl after her First Confession was, "I thought it would be hard and sad, instead it was easy and happy!" What a beautiful summary of repentance and returning to the loving embrace of the Lord.

May the joy of our First Holy Communicants re-enkindle the same in our souls. May the Confirmation of our young adults strengthen our resolution to live the Gospel in word and deed.

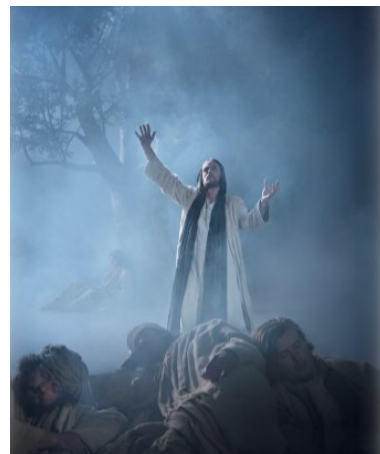

First Holy Communion and Confirmation 2020

The dates and times are set for First Holy Communion and Confirmation. All parents should have received the dates and times. If your child is to receive any of the two sacraments and you have not yet been notified please contact the Parish Office immediately. All candidates are also urged to go to confession before receiving their sacrament.

Students preparing for First Holy Communion must have received the sacraments of Baptism and Penance. In addition they are required to attend a Retreat/ Rehearsal. These began June 29 and 30, and July 1. There were three on each day 10:00 am, 4:00 pm and 6:30 pm. Retreats/Rehearsals will also be held tomorrow Monday, July 6 and on Tuesday, July 7 at 10:00 am, 4:00 pm and 6:00 pm. Only one parent is to accompany each child.

At the First Communion Liturgy only 28 First Holy Communion candidates and their family members will be in the church (one pew per family). All the liturgies will be live streamed except for the liturgy on September 7.

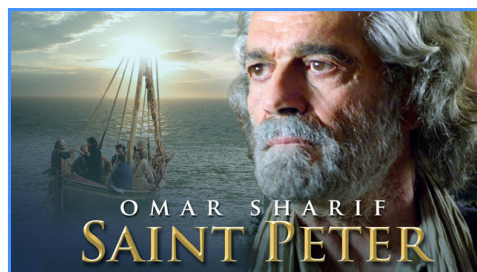

Would you like to support our priests and bishop in these challenging times? Is God calling you to a deeper life of prayer? Please consider joining the Seven Sisters Apostolate!

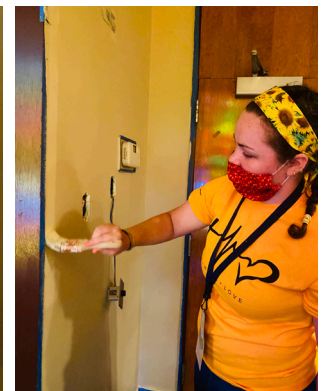
The Seven Sisters Apostolate is a worldwide mission of prayer for priests and bishops, formed to intercede for the needs and intentions of priests and bishops, supporting them in their vocation and ministry.

Seven women form a prayer team for one priest and commit to one Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration on a fixed day of the week for one year. St. Mary's has eight teams, one for each of our priests (including our new priest, Fr. Sina!), two for our diocesan priests in the Banica mission, as well as one for the bishop.

No specific time of day is required for the day to which you commit. Under normal circumstances, it is strongly preferred that the hour be made in a Catholic Church so as to adore the Lord in the monstrance or tabernacle. However, for the duration of the COVID health crisis or as long as as is needed for personal health/safety, members are welcome to pray from home if they prefer. Substitute members provide coverage in the event that a permanent member cannot fulfill her hour. Currently, we need assistance for every day of the week!

Siete mujeres forman un equipo de oración por un sacerdote y se comprometen a una Hora Santa de Adoración Eucarística en un día fijo de la semana durante un año. Santa María tiene ocho equipos, uno para cada uno de nuestros sacerdotes (¡incluido nuestro nuevo sacerdote, el Padre Sina!), Dos para nuestros sacerdotes diocesanos en la misión Banica, y uno para el obispo.

No se requiere una hora específica del día para el día en que se compromete. En circunstancias normales, se prefiere que se haga la hora en una Iglesia Católica para adorar al Señor en la custodia o tabernáculo. Pastoral Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa July 11 & 12

Our parish will take up a special collection next weekend for the Pastoral Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa. The Church in Africa is the fastest growing, but the poorest part of our family of faith. In the past thirty years, the number of Catholics in Africa has tripled, and priests have increased by 73%. At the same time over 70% of Africans live on less than \$2 a day, and as a result of armed conflict nearly 2.8 million refugees in Africa are displaced. Your financial contributions will help support pastoral outreach, catechetical programs, Catholic schools, evangelization, education of clergy and lay ministers, and your generosity is most appreciated.

Children's Charity for July

Children's Offertory Contributions for the month of July will be donated to Families of the Wounded Fund. This fund was created in 2005 to help the families of service members who come to McGuire Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Richmond with traumatic brain injuries and spinal-cord injuries from combat in Iraq and Afghanistan. Former Army Captain William Haneke, a wounded Vietnam Veteran, and some colleagues recognized the need to assist family members who were away from home tending to their loved ones when they saw two young mothers with babies arrive from across the country with no money and barely enough gas to make the trip. The organization gives 100 percent of all tax-deductible donations to the families to help with food, lodging, transportation, child care, diapers and long-distance calling cards during the many weeks a family is in the Richmond area, and each family currently receives \$7,500.00.
