Over 500 children have registered for Religious Education classes.

This theme focuses on the essential work of catechesis, which is an invitation to a whole new life given by Christ Himself. It emphasizes that living faith necessitates movement, inspiring all those who hear the Word to share it as witnesses of the true and living God."







Micah Furniture Bank

Micah Ecumenical Ministries of Fredericksburg is a 501(c)3 non-profit responsible for coordinating church efforts to cultivate community and care for neighbors who are, for a variety of reasons, ineligible for social services. Among the programs administered by Micah Ecumenical Ministries is the Micah Furniture Bank.

The Furniture Bank provides used furniture and household items to homeless and otherwise needy individuals and families who are being set up in housing in the greater Fredericksburg area. Since the Furniture Bank's inception, St. Mary parishioners have been supporting this important outreach ministry. If you would like to help, here's what you can do:

- 1. Donate furniture and household items. If you have unneeded furniture or household items, you can donate them to the furniture bank. You can either drop off items from 8:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, at the Micah warehouse located at 1212 Lafayette Boulevard, or you can schedule a Saturday pickup by calling Micah at 540-693-0472.
- 2. Join the St. Mary Pickup and Delivery Team. The team is always looking for individuals to help out with furniture deliveries and pickups. The team splits into crews of 2 to 4 people, depending on the size of the loads to be delivered or picked up. Some volunteers have pickup trucks or vehicles with utility trailers while others are just willing to help out loading and unloading the vehicles. The only requirement to join the team is a willingness to work with fellow parishioners in helping those in need in our area.

The St. Mary's team works the third Saturday of the month. The team meets at the Micah furniture warehouse at 8:00 a.m., loads up and delivers items from the warehouse to Micah clients, then picks up donated items and brings them to the warehouse. Delivery and pick-up assignments are usually completed by Noon. You do not need to volunteer every month.

Frequency of participation on the team is flexible. Volunteers do not have to work every month, only as their schedule permits. If you are interested in making a difference in the lives of the less fortunate in this area, join the St. Mary team.
