from our pastor pax et bonum

Dear Folks,

Another quick note to invite you to participate in our parish Special Event – "An Evening of Recollection" ~ Spiritual Reflections on our Parish Theme - Love One Another. Monday, September 28th 7:00pm via Facebook Live. With all that has been 2020, and after consulting with the Stewardship Committee, we settled on this theme for obvious reasons. Yes, we need listen to each other. Yes, we need to better understand one another. But listening and understanding are themselves not enough. We must heed our Lord's words to "love one another, as I have loved you."

Recently we read the parable of the Lord's mercy and generosity to the workers who all receive the same daily wage despite some working twelve hours, and others, one hour. I have often been struck by how gentle the parable is to those who only come out for the last hour of work. Jesus does not correct their "half-truth" response that nobody would hire them. He does not condemn them for having slept in all day. And He does not call out selfish motives. If Jesus, who knows all things, is merciful and kind with me for my mixed motives and imperfection, then how much more must I live likewise?

A great many of our issues today would melt away in the rays of divine mercy if each of us refused to guess and condemn the motives and hearts of our friends and enemies. So many of our sins today are sins of rash judgement. "Love one another" is not a suggestion or a cliche; it is a command from the Lord and a precondition for passing through the pearly gates.

During the pandemic, St. Mary of the Immaculate Conception has risen to this challenge in so many ways: record-breaking food drives, distance learning for the school and religious education, streaming Masses and devotions! Many of the ways that we meet, pray and serve have been in constant flux. Several of our ministries are in need of volunteers who are not high-risk for Covid. This year we want to highlight a few of the ways that you can serve right now!

Thank you for your generosity in serving and loving all of God's children.

Lectio Divina with Deacon Alberto

On Tuesday, October 6th, Deacon will begin guiding us weekly in separate Lectio Divina exercises in English and Spanish. This is to help us better appreciate and live the Word of God (Scripture). At every Mass the Word of God is proclaimed and explained to us. Deacon will guide us through the Mass readings for the following Sunday. He will begin on Zoom for a few weeks to help us understand the exercise and ask questions. After the few weeks he will use Facebook. Next week we will send you the English and Spanish Zoom links for October 6th. Below is short explanation of Lection Divina by Deacon Alberto in English and Spanish.

"Lectio Divina is Latin for "sacred reading," an ancient Christian spiritual practice of reading the Holy Scriptures with intentionality and devotion. This practice helps Christians center themselves and descend to the level of the heart to enter an inner-focused quiet space, finding God. This sacred reading is distinct from reading to obtain knowledge or information, or other types of reading. Furthermore, Lectio Divina is more than the pious practice of spiritual reading. Rather, it is the practice of opening ourselves to the action and inspiration of the Holy Spirit. As we intentionally focus our attentiveness and become present to the inner meaning of the scriptural text we are reading, the Holy Spirit enlightens our minds and hearts. We come to the text willing to be influenced by a deeper meaning that lies within the words and thoughts we ponder."

"Lectio Divina en latín significa "lectura sagrada", una antigua práctica espiritual cristiana de leer las Sagradas Escrituras con intencionalidad y devoción. Esta práctica ayuda a los cristianos a centrarse y descender al nivel del corazón para entrar en un espacio tranquilo centrado en el interior, encontrando a Dios. Esta lectura sagrada es distinta de la lectura para obtener conocimiento o información u otros tipos de lectura. Además, la Lectio Divina es más que la práctica piadosa de la lectura espiritual. Más bien, es la práctica de abrirnos a la acción y la inspiración del Espíritu Santo. A medida que enfocamos intencionalmente nuestra atención y nos hacemos presentes en el significado interno del texto bíblico que estamos leyendo, el Espíritu Santo ilumina nuestra mente y corazón. Llegamos al texto dispuestos a ser influenciados por un significado más profundo que se encuentra dentro de las palabras y pensamientos que meditamos."






