Holy Cross Academy Readying for Next Phase of Reopening

On November 2, Holy Cross Academy will adjust our education model to better meet the needs of our students. The current hybrid model allowed us to have a safe, successful start to the school year. Our students have been able to learn and adapt to the many new policies and procedures that are in place to ensure their safety. We have been able to establish routines for our in person and online learners alike and are wellprepared to welcome our students back full time.

This change in approach allows the opportunity for additional direct instruction, which is necessary to meet our high curriculum standards. Expanding on our current model ensures we are fulfilling our high expectation for teaching, learning, and faith formation at HCA. We have also had a chance to more thoroughly assess how the virus is impacting our area and local schools that have opened with all students on campus. The positivity rate of the virus in our area has decreased to near 5% which is well below the 10% threshold established as high risk by our health department.

It takes a village to educate a child. In the age of COVID, it takes a small army! We would like to thank our school community for the way it has rallied together to offer our students a safe, successful opening to the school year. We look forward to even more positive experiences with our students as we expand our in person instruction.

To assist teachers in adjusting to our new configuration, Holy Cross Academy will not be accepting new students during the month of November. New families can be admitted after the first trimester concludes after Thanksgiving.

Holy Cross Academy Students Give Back to Community

Our students are the best! We had another successful Manna Food Drive for the Fredericksburg Regional Food Bank last month. HCA students donated 754 pounds of goods to help the hungry in our region. That equates to 2,445 meals! The collection was so plentiful that it took an SUV and a minivan just to get the donations to the Food Bank!

In exchange for bringing in a donation, students were awarded with a "dress-down" day. While dressing out of uniform is always a treat for Catholic school students, the greater lesson of serving the poor among us is priceless. We're blessed at HCA to have multiple opportunities to give back to our community. In non-Covid years, our classrooms take turns making weekly lunches for the homeless shelter, which we pray to be able to start again soon. Each classroom has a Hope Project that they complete each year as well. Some classes visit nursing homes while others collect donations for local charities.

Instilling in our students a love for serving God's people is one of the greatest missions of a Catholic school. We are still accepting students for the 2020-21 school year through October and would love to share with you how HCA can be a blessing to your family. "Here I Am, Send Me"

Every year something special happens on the next to last Sunday of October – World Mission Sunday joins all Catholics of the world into one community of faith. At Mass that Sunday, we recommit ourselves to our common vocation, through Baptism, to be missionaries through prayer, participation in the Eucharist and by giving generously to the World Mission Sunday collection.

This year, Pope Francis asks us to respond to our baptismal call to mission by saying "Her I Am, Send Me." This is the mission that all Christians have received, and God give us the grace to live it out wherever we may be. Pope Francis invites the entire Church to support mission dioceses in Africa, Asia, the Pacific Islands and parts of Latin America and Europe where priests, religious and lay leaders serve the world's most vulnerable communities. In a world where so much divides us, World Mission Sunday rejoices in our unity as missionaries by our Baptism, as it offers each of us an opportunity to support the life-giving presence of the Church among the poor and marginalized in more than 1,111 mission dioceses.

Children's Charity for October

The children's charity that will benefit from Children's Offertory Envelopes in October is Safe Harbor Child Advocacy Center in Spotsylvania.
