from our pastor pax et bonum

Dear Folks.

What in the world is happening? I write this the day after the election.... or the day the real wrangling started. What will be relevant to say by this weekend? Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow. Ignorance of Jesus is ignorance of everything necessary.

Why do I so often exhort you to take an hour of adoration every week? Because even attending Mass every week without a life of prayer is like going to your own wedding and not knowing the person you are marrying. Having a real, enduring, and profound prayer life means embracing the difficult struggle of prayer.

I leave the rest of this week's column to St. Alphonsus Ligori:

"Jesus Christ finds means to console a soul that remains with a recollected spirit before the Most Blessed Sacrament, far beyond what the world can do with all its feasts and pastimes. Oh, how sweet a joy it is to remain with faith and tender devotion before an altar, and converse familiarly with Jesus Christ, who is there for the express purpose of listening to and graciously

hearing those who pray to him; to ask his pardon for the displeasures which we have caused him; to represent our wants to him, as a friend does to a friend in whom he places all his confidence; to ask him for his graces, for his love, and for his kingdom; but above all, oh, what a heaven it is there to remain making acts of love towards that Lord who is on the very altar praying to the Eternal Father for us, and is there burning with love for us. Indeed that love it is which detains him there, thus hidden and unknown, and where he is even despised by ungrateful souls! But why should we say more? "Taste and see."

On November 2, Holy Cross Academy will adjust our education model to better meet the needs of our students. The current hybrid model allowed us to have a safe, successful start to the school year. Our students have been able to learn and adapt to the many new policies and procedures that are in place to ensure their safety. We have been able to establish routines for our in person and online learners alike and are well-prepared to welcome our students back full time.

This change in approach allows the opportunity for additional direct instruction, which is necessary to meet our high curriculum standards. Expanding on our current model ensures we are fulfilling our high expectation for teaching, learning, and faith formation at HCA. We have also had a chance to more thoroughly assess how the virus is impacting our area and local schools that have opened with all students on campus. The positivity rate of the virus in our area has decreased to near 5% which is well below the 10% threshold established as high risk by our health department.

It takes a village to educate a child. In the age of COVID, it takes a small army! We would like to thank our school community for the way it has rallied together to offer our students a safe, successful opening to the school year. We look forward to even more positive experiences with our students as we expand our in person instruction.

To assist teachers in adjusting to our new configuration, Holy Cross Academy will not be accepting new students during the month of November. New families can be admitted after the first trimester concludes after Thanksgiving.






St. Mary is Seeking Sacristan



Armistice Day 2020 — 102 Years Ago...

On the eleventh hour of the eleventh day in the eleventh month of the year 1918, an armistice was signed, ending the "war to end all wars." This year we celebrate the 102nd Anniversary of the signing of that armistice.

November 11 was set aside as Armistice Day in the United States to remember the sacrifices that men and women made during the war in order to ensure a lasting peace. In 1938 Congress voted Armistice Day as a legal holiday, but World War II began the following year. Armistice Day was still observed after the end of the Second World War. In 1953 townspeople in Emporia, Kansas called the holiday Veterans' Day in gratitude to the veterans in their town. Soon after, Congress passed a bill renaming the national holiday to Veterans' Day. Today, we remember in our prayers all those who have served for our country in the armed forces.
