Dear Folks,

Three things:

1. We had National Vocations Week come to an end last Sunday, and we welcomed a seminarian who spoke of his vocation at eight of our eleven Masses. Today, on the page next to this one, is a reflection from a cloistered nun on the occasion of her 25th Anniversary. Please, if you read nothing else in this bulletin today, go read it now.

2. ...Ok, welcome back. Thanks be to God for the folks who helped cover the cost of moving the tabernacle to the center of our sanctuary. The cost of the move and the new candlesticks was completely covered by direct donations, so that there is no impact on Sunday collections.

from our pastor

vocations week

Some priests describe the Poor Clare Monastery in Alexandria as the “praying heart of the diocese.” Recently one of the Sisters, a Paul IV grad and former member of the George Mason University Women’s Soccer Team, celebrated her Silver Jubilee. Following is an excerpt of a letter she wrote her family after the celebration, sharing a bit about her call to this mysterious and beautiful vocation.

“I feel like I am standing under an immense waterfall of grace, prayer, support, love, attention, gratitude, joy, I couldn’t earn it, I don’t deserve it... I am more in awe at the married vocation and the life of a pastor than ever before. Your day in and day out commitment, sacrifice, care, thoughtfulness, attentiveness, planning, encouraging exceeds anything I could ever comprehend.”

It has been interesting for me to think/pray about the aspects in the homily where Father kept returning to enclosure and how it baffles... I remember that was a particularly challenging aspect for me, especially in regards to you each, my family. I learned that the Poor Clare’s in Cleveland had extern sisters, so no vow of enclosure, but not in Alexandria...I weighed that out for a while. In the end, in my 21 year old heart and mind, it came down to: am I willing to give to Jesus all the unmerited gifts I have received or am I going to try to make some sort of deal and hold on to a few things (over which I have no control anyways – everyone’s lifespan)? Did He or did He not die for me on the Cross and so is present in the Eucharist for me? And as I would pray in chapels, it always came back to that reality...did I believe it and how would I respond? Until somehow by the grace of God I could say, ‘They are yours, they belong to you, you made them.’ And since then, my own experience has taught me that I am much closer to family, friends and even noticing God’s handiwork than ever before.

That wasn’t even part ‘of the deal’ as I understood it, but it is part of the gospel. Part of the 100-fold, it is the more. Some parts of Scripture don’t make sense right away, but over time a word, a phrase, an idea captivates. And if somehow my life, vocation, community opens the mind up a little more to that reality (The Good News: God became man; Jesus Christ and the entire Paschal Mystery, including our resurrection) that is not easily comprehended or thought about, than that’s enough. We have received the faith to know that there is a God (all-good) and that His greatest desire is to share His life with us.

Most of the sisters here entered between 20-30 years old. None of us, I think, could explain exactly the reason why, in a 1-2-3 sort of way and still probably can’t though at times we try to, to ourselves or others. It is part of a mystery greater than ourselves. I love the phrase from Adrienne Von Speyr, Lord, do not let us live without mystery. In the document on The Contemplative Life and Enclosure of Nuns (1999), the word mystery appears again and again. We are guardians of the mystery of the Church. Just this week in the daily liturgy St. Paul in Ephesians (5:33) writes: This is a great mystery, but I speak in reference to Christ and the Church. A passage from the above document that I really like says:

“In watchful waiting for the Lord’s return, the cloister becomes a response to the absolute love of God for his creature and the fulfillment of his eternal desire to welcome the creature into the mystery of intimacy with the Word, who gave himself as Bridegroom in the Eucharist and remains in the tabernacle as the heart of full communion with him, drawing to himself the entire life of the cloistered nun in order to offer it constantly to the Father. To the gift of Christ the Bridegroom, who on the Cross offered his body unreservedly, the nun responds in like terms with the gift of the “body”, offering herself with Jesus Christ to the Father and cooperating with him in the work of redemption...(Verbi Sponsa n.3)”

I didn’t know any of this before I entered. I just responded to His call and it was and is a mystery to me. The best definition I’ve ever heard of human freedom fits here: the capacity to adhere to God’s mysterious initiative towards man. His Presence has a gentle, irresistible power. Just when I thought I’d close my eyes, go for a run, turn up the radio: He was there inside me. There was no sleeping, running, singing that impeded Him coming after me.

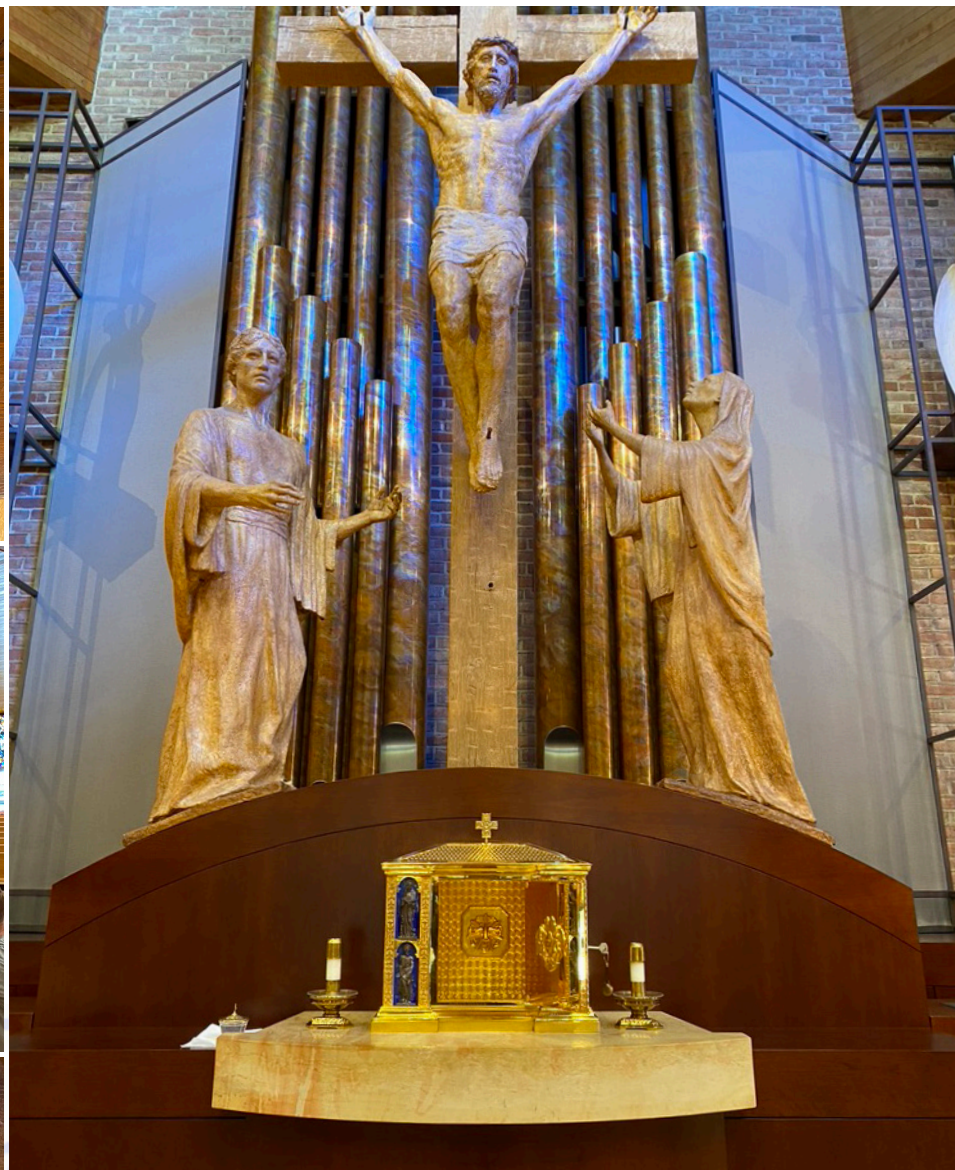

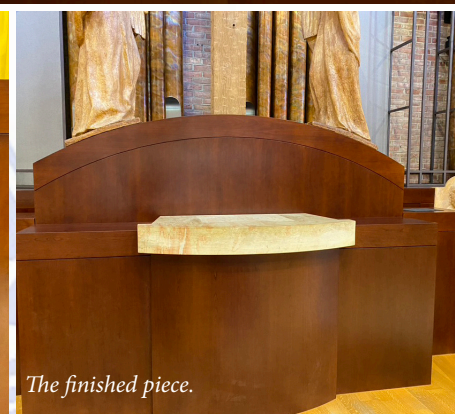
