

Dear Folks,

'Twas the Sunday before Christmas and all through the parish, not a soul was stirring, not even the man who changes the candles.... Ok, wait, he is always working.

As I say every year: carefully pick your Christmas Mass! The Christmas Eve Masses are always crazy packed, but what will the pandemic bring? How many folks will come? Will folks be able to find the Expo Center?

The only question I can seemingly answer is: yes, folks will find the Expo Center, because we are Easter Expo Center experts!

So what can I tell you about which Masses will be crowded? Probably all of the Christmas Eve Masses. There seems to be the most 'buzz' around the 2pm and 4pm Masses. Yes, we need volunteer help, especially ushering. No, I don't know which Masses might be packed. Please be patient. 2020 has taught us many things, including that things are not always how we like them.

My personal guess, is that the 'least full' Mass is likely to be the 7am on Christmas Day. And yes, we are asking all folks to wear masks to Christmas Mass. This is in accord with the new directives from the governor, and a small sacrifice we can freely offer to be able to pray with our brothers and sisters in Christ.



Lectio Divina on St. Mary Facebook with **Deacon Alberto in English and Spanish**

On Tuesday, December 21 go to the parish website at stmaryfred. **org** and click to the "Live Stream of Masses and Devotions!" tab. Lectio Divina will be in English at 7pm and Spanish at 7:30pm.

Lectio Divina: "First one goes to a quiet place and recalls that one is about to listen to the Word of God. Then one reads the scripture passage aloud to let oneself hear with his or her own ears the words. When one finishes reading, pause and recall if some word or



phrase stood out or something touched one's heart. If so, pause and savor the insight, feeling, or understanding. Then go back and read the passage again because it will have a fuller meaning. Pause again and note what happened. If one wants to dialogue with God or Jesus in response to the word, one should follow the prompting of one's heart. This kind of reflective listening allows the Holy Spirit to deepen awareness of God's taking the initiative to speak with us."

Religious Education Safe Environment Training 2020

This year parents are asked to conduct the Safe Environment training at home. The program this year is called "Family/Large Group Safe Environment Presentation - Love and Responsibility" program. "This group presentation focuses on friendship as expressed within the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony or Marriage. It is intended to be most effective through family specific discussion groups. Particular attention has been given to the virtue of chastity and the understanding of liberty and freedom."

The Safe Environment Training 2020 was sent to parents on December 9, 2020. This "Child and Youth Training is designed to educate children about specific dangers of the world while protecting the child's innocence and respecting their intelligence. All programs are designed to be used in cooperation with efforts by parents and work best when parents are involved."

After parents have done the presentation, they are to fill out the "Safe Environment Homeschooling Training Verification Form and email it to religioused@stmaryfred.org no later than January 15, 2021.

The Consecration to the Holy Family

Families who have completed the steps for Consecration to the Holy Family are welcome to attend either the 8:30am or 10:30am Mass at Holy Cross Academy on Sunday, December 27th to receive a special blessing.

Why Consecrate your family to the Holy Family? Families today face many struggles, both through cultural pressure and through the personal struggles that accompany family life. Despite these struggles — and partly as a result of conquering them — families have great capacity for love and joy, a joy that is strengthened through the peace and truth found in Christ.

How to Prepare for the Consecration:

The word consecration literally means "association with the sacred", and as such it requires a much larger commitment than simply reciting a prayer off of a card. To receive the full benefit of intercession from the Holy Family, one must cleanse the body, mind and soul. The decision to consecrate your family needs to be intentional and a process through which you completely surrender to God through the Holy Family. You are accepting the truth that salvation history was changed forever by a family, and that through your domestic church, you are called to live their example.

Steps to Prepare:

- 1. Discuss the importance of this consecration as a family and why you are doing it.
- 2. Each member of your family is strongly encouraged to receive the sacrament of reconciliation.
- 3. As a family, intentionally choose something to fast from. The fast can be for at least a week. As our physical bodies are drawn to things of the world, it is strongly encouraged that you fast from something that you would normally do or consume. Fasting helps to discipline our minds and hearts to refrain from secular activities and be more focused on God.
- 4. Prepare for the commitment you are making. Consecration to the Holy Family is not a single event. You have chosen a way of life for your family. You and your family are consciously choosing to be a beacon of light of God's love through his Church.

Children's Charity for December

Our Children's Charity for the month of December is the Office of Migration & Refugee Services (MRS) in Fredericksburg, which assists refugee families and children, who have fled their homeland in fear of persecution and in fear for their lives. After a lengthy resettlement process through the US Government, approved families arrive with no material possessions other than the clothes on their back. With only 1 to 2 weeks' notice, MRS "Welcomes the Stranger" and assists families with housing, food, employment, schooling for their children and many other urgent needs. Camp Rainbow is held every Spring for children who are coping with the loss of a loved one.

Camp Rainbow provides a path for child campers along their journey through grief and toward healing. Little Buddies (child participants) are paired with trained Big Buddies (adult volunteers) to explore their feelings through age-appropriate crafts, activities, discussions and one-on-one time. Expressive therapies such as art, music and dance are used to assist children with their grief and are balanced with traditional camp activities, like arts and crafts, kayaking, and singing by the fire.
