

Statement by Bishop Michael F. Burbidge, Catholic Diocese of Arlington, on the Inauguration of President Joe Biden

Upon the inauguration of President Joe Biden and Vice President Kamala Harris, I ask Catholics and people of goodwill to pray for all elected leaders as they take on the task of carrying out the nation's work. We pray also for peace, civility and unity in our nation. The smooth transition of power is a hallmark of our extraordinary American experience and vital to the endurance of our thriving republic.

Please pray that our new President will uphold the truths revealed and proclaimed in the Catholic Faith he professes. May the Lord grant him the wisdom and compassion to protect the most vulnerable, especially the unborn; respect the dignity of all people; uphold the traditional family as the foundation of society; defend the principle of religious freedom upon which this nation was founded; and advocate for the rights of the poor.

May we take this moment to pray that, with God's grace, we can heal the discord and wounds that exist in our country, communities and even families. May we invoke the prayer attributed to St. Francis of Assisi in asking, "Lord, make me an instrument of your peace. Where there is hatred, let me sow love. Where there is injury, pardon. Where there is doubt, faith..." We call on all elected and public officials, regardless of party, to transcend political divides in service to the common good.






Happy New Year

Lectio Divina on St. Mary Facebook with Deacon Alberto on Tuesday, January 26 at 7pm

During this pandemic, your prayer life — among other things — may have been disrupted. We've had to find different ways of praying without an in-person community to support our faith life. The traditional monastic practice of Lectio Divina is a good way to help us deal with stress and provide a way to enter into sacred Scripture as a living word for our time.

The focus of Lectio Divina is not a critical analysis of sacred text, but rather a more personal way of experiencing the word through contemplation and reflection. The constitution Dei Verbum of the Second Vatican Council recommended the practice of Lectio Divina for the faithful and was later affirmed by Pope Benedict XVI.

Although any scripture passage can be used, Lectio is an excellent way of preparing for the Sunday proclamation of the Gospel.

The traditional practice of Lectio Divina has 4 parts: Lectio (read), Meditatio (meditate), Oratio (pray) and Contemplatio (contemplate). As the scripture text is read multiple times, it allows us to go deeper and deeper into the text.

To pray Lectio Divina, you will need a copy of Scripture. A pen and a notebook are also helpful to write down your thoughts, reflections and prayers. Find a place that is free from distractions. This prayer usually takes about half an hour.

Begin by quieting yourself and becoming aware of your breathing. Let go of the concerns of the day and invite the Holy Spirit to guide your reflection. You may want to repeat the verse from Psalm 46:10 over and over again: "Be still and know I am God." unleashthegospel.org/2020/07/a-guide-to-the-lectio-divina-prayer-style/

Safe Environment Training for Religious Education Students

The Safe Environment Training presentation primarily consists of four discussions based on Church teachings.

- **1. Discussion on Freedom:** Freedom is the power to act or not to act, and so perform deliberate acts of one's own. Freedom attains perfection in its acts when directed toward God, the sovereign Good. (CCC 1744)
- **2. Discussion of Creation:** "God created us as male and female in His own image. ... We are created to live in relationship or friendship with each other, our environment and to make a gift of ourselves to others within a proper order as provided through Sacred Scripture and church teaching."
- **3. Discussion on Relationship:** "Name various relationships that you see and experience what are the difference between the relationships? 1. Spouse vs. child 2. Sibling vs. cousins 3. Family vs. friends 4. Friends vs. coworkers"
- 4. **Discussion on Modesty:** "This moral virtue, often also called "decency," moderates and controls the impulse of sexual display and responsiveness thereto by men and women." We prepare ourselves for relationships by fostering the virtue of modesty in dress, speech, thoughts, deeds, habits, entertainment and friends.
