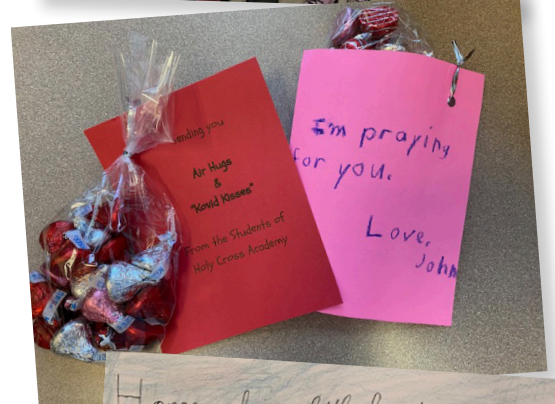

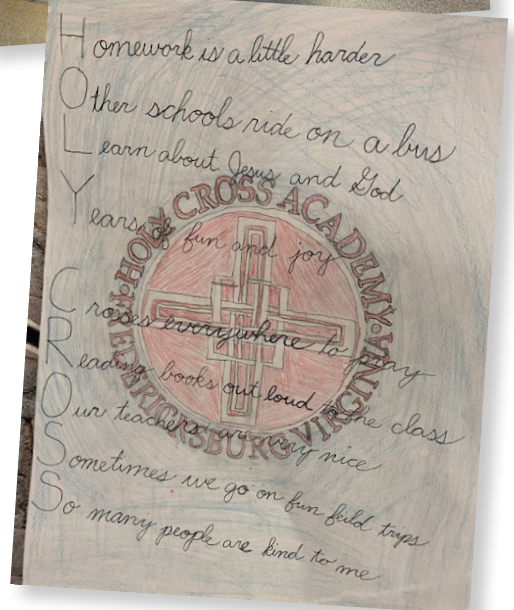
Souper Thank You!

'I want them to know there's hope'

"I didn't have a good upbringing. My father was abusive. I spent a lot of time on the street. At 11 or 12, I started using drugs to make the pain go away. After school, kids go home. I didn't. I stayed on the streets after school. Sometimes, I would stay at friend's house or sleep in the alleyways between houses. I had feelings of worthlessness, hopelessness, not belonging, feeling lost, not knowing who I was supposed to be. I became an addict. I was walking the streets at night, doing drugs. It was so cold some nights I was afraid to sit down. I knew if I sat down I might not get back up. My mother's father froze to death. She used to tell me, 'If you're cold, keep moving. Keep your blood flowing.' I never forgot that. By morning, I'd be so exhausted.



One day, I made it to the community breakfast at Micah, I broke down, physically and mentally. I went to the hospital for 15 days. After that, I went to Micah's Respite House. That's where it seemed to turn around. I never felt the love I felt there. I didn't understand it at first. It was like a family. People came in and fixed dinner and we prayed before meals. From the Respite House, I went into housing.

I'm in the Bridge to Work Program. One day at Micah, one of the volunteers was talking about how important appearances are when you go to a job interview. She wanted me to put on a nice shirt and tie, so I did. I'd never worn a suit in my life. It made me feel like I was so much more than I ever realized. I felt like a man. Like I was somebody. I cried. My father always told me I was never going to be anything. After a while, you start to believe it. For the first time in my life, I thought, 'He's wrong. I am somebody.'

Even though my earthly father was abusive, I have a heavenly father who loves me. And that keeps me going. For the first time in my life, I'm all right. I'm thankful to be alive. People say I seem happy. Before, I moped around a lot. I've come such a long way. If there is anyone out there who feels hopeless, I want them to know there is hope. They can turn their life around.

CRS Rice Bowl 2021: For Lent For Life:

Week 2: Salama, Madagascar

Half of all children in Madagascar are undernourished, meaning they don’t have enough nutritious food to stay healthy. Parents want their children to grow up healthy and strong, and the puppet shows give them new knowledge they can use right away to make sure that happens. Community health workers trained by CRS use the puppets to teach families about how doctor visits, hand washing and rainbow foods—different colored foods like tomatoes and carrots that have important vitamins and nutrients—are necessary to stay healthy.

Frankline and Labaladezy have eight children. Their youngest child, Thorin, is almost a year old. While Frankline was pregnant with Thorin, she and her husband Labaladezy watched the puppet shows and learned new ways to support Thorin’s growth and development. When Thorin was born, his parents fed him different, more nutritious foods and took him to the health center for regular check-ups. The discipline of the Church includes abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent (solid purple days) and fasting from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting includes one regular meal, and the other two small meals are not to exceed a regular meal in quantity, with nothing between meals.



The Sacred Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, Easter Sunday) Will be celebrated entirely at the Fredericksburg Expo Center in order for us to accommodate the maximum number of parishioners.

"Tre Ore," The Seven Last Words

Although not a part of the formal observance of the Sacred Triduum Rites as such, this is a traditional custom of many churches. The seven last words of Jesus as he is crucified on the cross are presented every 25 minutes, each with a congregational hymn and choral selections. Clergy will give a reflection for each of the words of Jesus and the Three Hours will conclude with the public praying of the Stations of the Cross.

The Vigil of the Resurrection of the Lord

What Sunday is to the week, Easter Sunday is to the year. This holiest of nights we celebrate the victory over death and promise of eternal life given to us by Jesus Christ in his resurrection from the dead. The Liturgy includes the Service of Light, the Vigil of Readings and Psalms, the Celebration of the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation for those who have prepared all year for initiation in the Catholic Church, and Liturgy of the Eucharist. 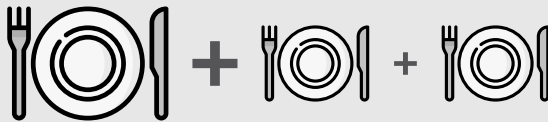

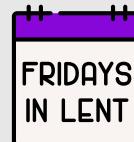

INTERESTING NOTE

Canon 1250 names Fridays all year long as penitential days which should be marked by some sort of sacrifice and penance. While abstinence from meat is a traditional sacrifice, Canon 1253 leaves the decision for the particular sacrifice up to the local conference of Bishops. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has obtained permission from the Holy See for Catholics in the USA to substitute a different penitential, or even charitable, practice for abstinence from meat during the year, if they so choose.

Abstinence from meat is obligatory during Lent everywhere.

Those Outside the Age Limits

and those whose state in life (e.g. pregnant women, manual laborers, those who are ill) may be excused from the requirements of fasting and abstinence, but are encouraged to take up some other form of penitence or acts of charity or piety.



Please Note

These guidelines are the minimum requirements for Lenten sacrifices. All are encouraged to impose some sort of personal penance or act of charity or piety on top of these minimums.

You could increase the number of days you practice fasting and/or abstinence, or abstain from a favorite food or activity for all of Lent. You could add things, such as committing to read the Bible for 20 minutes per day.

As in all things, Lenten penance and mortification calls for prudence.



It is wise to consult your spiritual director before undertaking additional Lenten practices.
