The Sacrament of Confirmation for Adults

Are you an adult who was never confirmed? We are hosting classes for you! Receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit in a profound way - THIS Pentecost!

To register, contact Deacon Alberto at **deaconalberto1@gmail.com** before April 28th. The Sacrament of Confirmation will take place on Sunday, May 23 at 7pm Mass~ The Feast of Pentecost.

What adults are eligible for confirmation?

Those adults who:

- are baptized into the Roman Catholic church (those baptized in another Christian church are eligible for confirmation through the Rite of Reception into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church, and are not the subject of these guidelines) have subhrated their First Communion
- have celebrated their First Communion
- are not presently barred from the sacraments (most commonly for reasons relating to an irregular marriage situation)
- are capable of renewing their baptismal promises

Generally, this guideline refers to persons who are baptized Catholics who have received some catechesis within the Catholic Christian community. These are active adult Catholics who for some reason did not receive Confirmation at the usual age. Proof of their baptism comes in the form of a copy of their baptismal certificate obtained from their parish of baptism.

This past year American Heritage Girl Troop VA 0128, from St Mary's, celebrated our troop's tenth year anniversary. AHG is a faith based K-12 organization divided into units based on age. AHG VA 0128 is sponsored by A. Mary's Council of Catholic Women, and is supported by Knights of Columbus Council 4034.

Even in the midst of the Coronavirus pandemic, our troop has still thrived! We met outside in the parking lot in late summer and early fall, and in winter, were able to meet inside our parish school's gymnasium, socially distanced with masks. When we've had bad weather or due to restrictions we have met online and worked on religious emblems. We've even been able to have a big troop camping trip!

Aside from all that our troop is extremely active during regular times, our troop has hosted and organized a regional camporee, and it has been the largest AHG Gathering in the country! We have done this for several years now, and the most recent camporee in October 2019 had troops from 7 states and almost a thousand girls, leaders, and instructors. We worked on Archery, Shooting, Rock Climbing, Astronomy, Self-Defense, and so much more! Our troop has also prepared March For Life Care Packages for 500 attendees from local parishes and schools. We do lots of badges under the categories Heritage, Family Living, Arts, Outdoor Skills, Personal Well-Being, and Science and Technology. Along with badges girls earn Sports Pins, Religious Awards, Level Awards, and Activity Patches. Our troop also does many service projects like Memorial Day Luminaria at the Fredericksburg National Cemetery, a luminaria at St Mary's for the feast of the Immaculate Conception, Wreaths Across America, and many more!

I've been with this troop since I was 5 when the troop started, and am soon to embark on my Stars and Stripes final AHG Project. It has been a very fun and active ten years, and I have greatly enjoyed having the opportunity to build friendships, do service projects, grow in my faith, learn and develop new skills, and strive to be a woman of integrity!
