Dear Folks,

A Blessed Pentecost Sunday to you!

Fr. Kelly moving to Leesburg. On June 24, per the Bishop's appointment Fr. Kelly will be moving to Leesburg for assignment to both St. John the Apostle, and further studies at Divine Mercy University in Sterling. Yep. He is so good that he gets two assignments!

I have greatly appreciated his presence and wisdom in the rectory. Every answer is well thought out and insightful. The entire parish has benefited from his ability to teach concisely and precisely. He will be greatly missed, even if he never could get on my 'orange train.' God Bless the Irishman!

Fr. Phillip Cozzi will be coming from Front Royal to replace him, thank you for welcoming him.

Priest moves always present a moment of sadness and necessity. As we close out the Easter season, we recall Jesus leaving so that He could send us the Spirit in power and might on Pentecost Sunday! He loves and sanctifies us in millions of ways every day from Baptism to the grave. The coming and going of priests is a concrete reminder to all of the faithful that we must love Jesus first, not the men who serve Him.

Masks and Social distancing?

Recently Governor Northam noted that "CDC guidelines state that fully-vaccinated individuals do not have to wear masks in most indoor settings, except on public transit, in health care facilities, and in congregate settings" Having consulted with diocesan lawyers, it is unclear if "congregate settings" include religious services. Additionally we understand that

many parishioners will interpret this announcement to mean they can attend Mass without wearing a face covering. We do not desire to inhibit vaccinated folks from worshiping and nor do we wish to inquire about anyone's vaccination status.

Next weekend the social distancing and capacity requirement in the church will be eliminated. If you desire a little more controlled environment, we intend to keep the Parish Life Center (PLC) open for socially distanced seating.

Additionally, the 8:30 am Mass at HCA (that was added for the pandemic) will remain "Masks-required" and "Social Distanced Seating." This is being done for our most vulnerable parishioners so that they can have an option with which they are comfortable.

Above all we encourage charity, understanding and patience with one another. And that is this year's theme: "Love one Another, especially during a pandemic."

TRUE REFORMERS: EPISODE 3 ST. PHILIP NERI

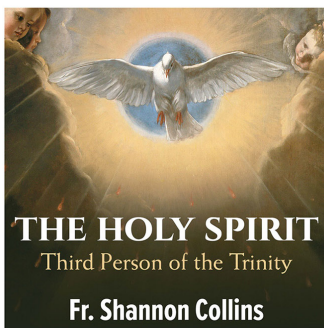

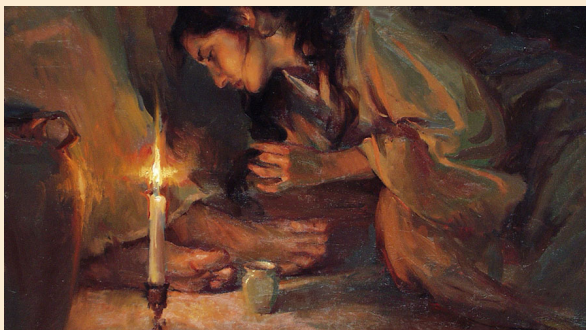

Seven Sisters

Would you like to support our priests and bishop in these challenging times? Is God calling you to a deeper life of prayer? Please consider joining the Seven Sisters Apostolate!

The Seven Sisters Apostolate is a worldwide mission of prayer for priests and bishops, formed to intercede for the needs and intentions of priests and bishops, supporting them in their vocation and ministry.

Seven women form a prayer team for one priest, and commit to one Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration per week. Each member prays on a fixed day of the week for one year (June to June). St. Mary's has eight teams, one for each of our priests, two for our diocesan priests in the Banica mission, as well as one for the bishop.



Any hour of the day is permissible for the day to which you commit, and need not always be at the same time. Under normal circumstances, it is strongly preferred that the hour be made in a Catholic Church so as to adore the Lord in the monstrance or tabernacle. However, for the duration of the COVID health crisis or as long as as is needed for personal health/

safety, members are welcome to pray from home if they prefer. Substitute members provide coverage in the event that a permanent member cannot fulfill her hour.

En lugar de forcejear con la fertilidad o ir en contra de ella, las parejas aprenden a entender las señales naturales de fertilidad y cooperar con ellas con el fin de tomar decisiones bien informadas y en oración con respecto al crecimiento de su familia.

La planificación natural de la familia es un método moderno y científicamente probado que procura detectar las variaciones naturales que ocurren en el organismo de la mujer durante el lapso de fertilidad que hay en cada ciclo. En base a lo que puedan observar, las parejas pueden actuar según sea conveniente, ya sea para lograr un embarazo o posponerlo.
