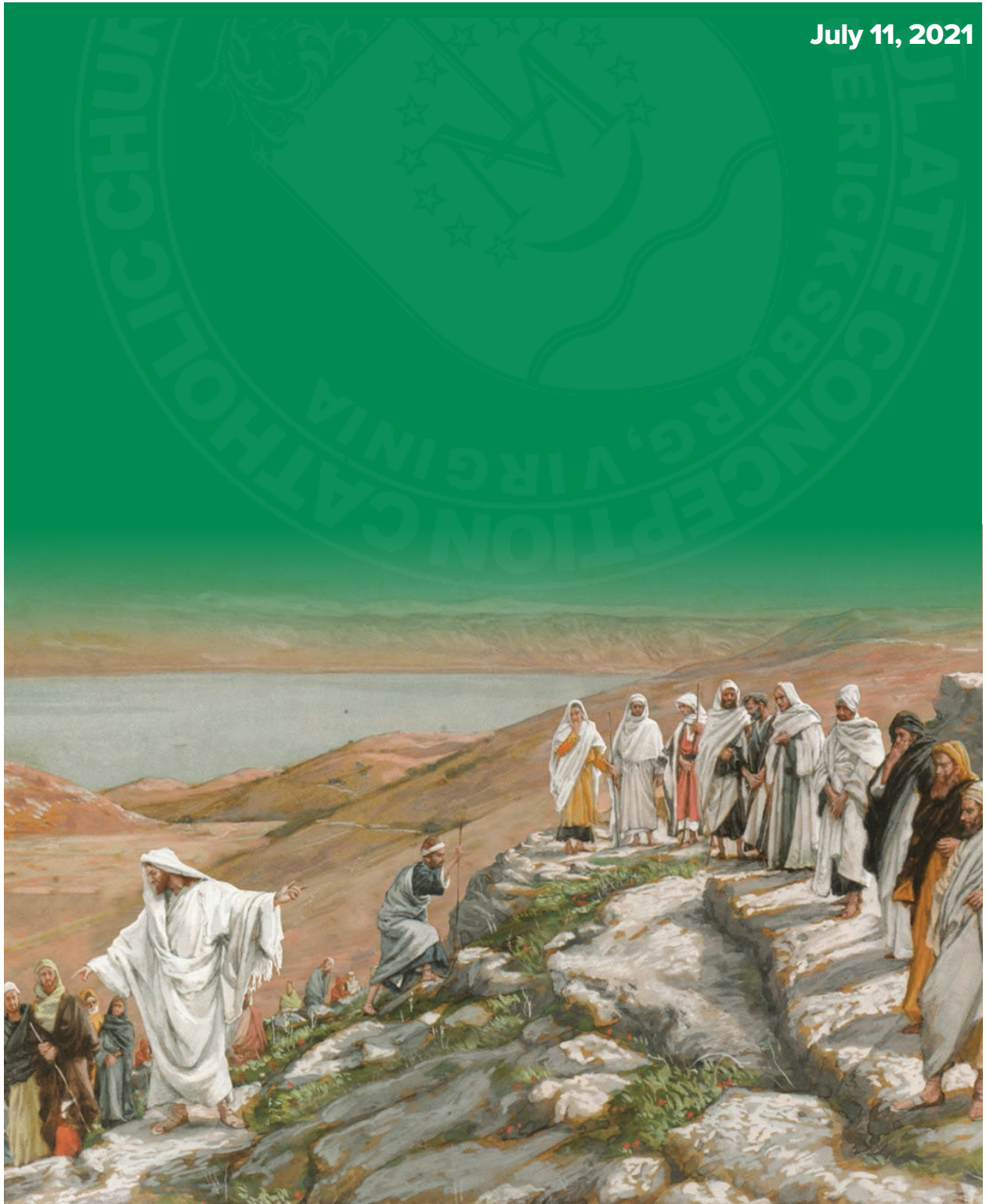

# from our pastor

# pax et bonum

Dear Folks,

This week I read, and shared on Facebook, words from a homily on the priesthood by the Cardinal who would become Benedict XVI. (A short link to the article: <https://tinyurl.com/w77v8bsn>).

Some of the words echo back a theme that Fr. Kelly touched upon as he was leaving: **that he wants you to know Jesus**. In a priestly vocation the Lord touches a man and invites him to intimacy that exceeds both imagination and expectations. To know Him as friend and Lord is at the heart of the invitation received and passed on. That encounter is not unique to us, but priests are also gifted with being an instrument to enkindle that fire of love in other souls!

The future pope added this personal story about the bond of friendship and grace:

*When I cross Saint Peter's Square, indeed, when I simply step out of the house, I encounter people from all countries, of all ages, from all walks of life. They recognize me as a bishop and are glad because a bishop is for them a successor of the apostles, a bearer of the mystery of the Church, a messenger of Jesus Christ. Again and again it is as though we are all old friends. No one is a stranger to the other. Through the faith, we*

*are all acquainted. Through the Church, we all belong to each other. And what is most moving for me is the joy that is alive in all these encounters.*

I know people (with pictures to prove it) who encountered him exactly as he speaks of walking across St. Peter's Square at the same time each day. Their stories of his humility and warmth chatting with him stuck in my memory.

So, thank you Fr. Kelly, and all of the priests who have and will serve you and all believers. And on behalf of our priests, thank you for the warmth and kindness of your love for the priesthood. The Lord has brought us together and let our paths cross so that we might share in His love. But above all, thank the Lord who accomplishes all these good things in us.

All goodness is an unmerited gift from the Blessed Trinity!

## Importance of Religious Education

- Families create a solid foundation for the child's later religious and spiritual formation when parents:
- Create a family environment that is warm, inviting, peaceful and emotionally safe.
- Satisfy their child's basic needs for love, security, touch, good nutrition, and attention.
- Encourage the child to associate with people who share similar personal values, lifestyles, and spiritual convictions.
- Invite grandparents, Godparents, extended family, friends, and parish members to share parenting responsibilities.
- Identify and resolve major differences between themselves concerning parenting styles, moral values, or faith issues.
- Establish a routine for personal prayer, study, and spiritual growth, both as individuals, as a couple and as a family.
- Participate in the parish faith community and especially the Religious Education program..

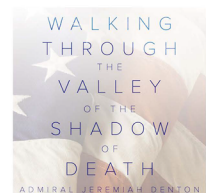

## Special Collection for the Children's Programs of the FXBG Area Food Bank

### July 17 & 18

Next weekend we will take up a special collection for the following Children's Programs of the Fredericksburg Area Food Bank:

### Food For Families School Food Pantry

The mission of the School Food Pantry program is to help alleviate child hunger for families in crisis. School-based pantries are located on the grounds of a school to provide a more readily accessible source of emergency food assistance to students and their families. As a need is identified by school staff, the pre-packed boxes containing a few days of emergency food, along with resource materials such as a pantry reference list and SNAP information, are distributed to the families in need.

### Club Kids

This structured after-school snack program provides nutrition among at-risk children, ages 4-18 years, in an environment that is safe, accessible, and convenient. Over 3,000 kids are being fed monthly at sites throughout our service area. Sites are located at schools, faith-based organizations, the Boys and Girls Club.

### Club Kids II

This structured after-school snack program provides nutrition among at-risk children, ages 4-18 years, and are enrolled in a participating after-school program. The mission of Club Kids II is to provide nutritious, freshly prepared snacks to children in an environment that is safe, accessible, and convenient. Sites are located at organizations that provide after-school programming for youth such as the Boys and Girls Club, Hazel Hill & Heritage Park.

### Kids on the Go Summer Feeding

Kids on the Go is a program of the Fredericksburg Regional Food Bank which provides children attending summer school or other summer enrichment programs with a healthy prepared meal. Kids on the Go helps to alleviate childhood hunger by bridging the hunger gap when a reliable source of food may not be available. Children 18 years of age and younger are welcome to receive a free, freshly prepared, well-balanced meal at any of our sponsored sites.

## Children's Offertory Envelopes for July

Children's Offertory Contributions for the month of July will be donated to Families of the Wounded Fund. This fund was created in 2005 to help the families of service members who come to McGuire Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Richmond with traumatic brain injuries and spinal-cord injuries from combat in Iraq and Afghanistan. Former Army Captain William Haneke, a wounded Vietnam Veteran, and some colleagues recognized the need to assist family members who were away from home tending to their loved ones when they saw two young mothers with babies arrive from across the country with no money and barely enough gas to make the trip. The organization gives 100 percent of all tax-deductible donations to the families to help with food, lodging, transportation, child care, diapers and long-distance calling cards during the many weeks a family is in the Richmond area, and each family who qualifies currently receives \$9,000.
